MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

SALT AND LIGHT

In today's Gospel Jesus says to his disciples—and therefore to us—"You are the salt of the earth" and "You are the light of the world." These metaphors are a call to action. We are to make a difference in our world for the better. We cannot just blend in—if so, we are like salt gone flat. The prophecy of Isaiah in our First Reading shows us the sort of light we are to be: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the

homeless; Clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own." We are blessed to have many parishioners who share their bread with the hungry thorough Agnes Table and the St. Francesca Resource Center; who shelter the homeless by volunteering at Sojourner House; who make or donate coats, mittens, quilts and clothes to the needy. Supporting Catholic Charities and Catholic Relief Services enables us all to extend our influence on a large scale.

This coming Saturday, February 11, is the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes and the 31st annual World Day of the Sick. Mass will be celebrated at St. Charles at 11:00 that morning, during which the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered. A lunch will follow. Anyone with a serious or chronic illness may be anointed. I hope that family members or neighbors will make an effort to bring to church any homebound parishioners who are able to come, but cannot usually get to Mass. Those who will receive the sacrament will receive a sticker to identify them as candidates for anointing. Healthcare workers or other care givers are welcome to come and they will receive a blessing at the end of the Mass.

Pope Francis has chosen Jesus' words in the conclusion of the parable of the Good Samaritan as this year's theme: "Take care of him." (Luke 10:35) He says:

The World Day of the Sick calls for prayer and closeness towards those who suffer. Yet it also aims to raise the awareness of God's people, healthcare institutions and civil society with regard to a new way of moving forward together...Indeed, the conclusion of the parable of the Good Samaritan suggests how the exercise of fraternity, which began as a face-to-face encounter, can be expanded into organized care. The elements of the inn, the innkeeper, the money and the promise to remain informed of the situation (cf. *Lk* 10:34-35) all point to the commitment of healthcare and social workers, family members and volunteers, through whom good stands up in the face of evil every day, in every part of the world.

Reflecting on our recent experience of a pandemic, Pope Francis says: These past years of the pandemic have increased our sense of gratitude for those who work each day in the fields of healthcare and research. Yet it is not enough to emerge from such an immense collective tragedy simply by honoring heroes. COVID-19 has strained the great networks of expertise and solidarity, and has exposed the structural limits of existing public welfare systems. Gratitude, then, needs to be matched by actively seeking, in every country, strategies and resources in order to guarantee each person's fundamental right to basic and decent healthcare.

Finally, anticipating this year's observance, the Holy Father says:
On 11 February 2023, let us turn our thoughts to the Shrine of
Lourdes, a prophetic lesson entrusted to the Church for our
modern times. It is not only what functions well or those who are
productive that matter. Sick people, in fact, are at the center of
God's people, and the Church advances together with them as a
sign of a humanity in which everyone is precious and no one
should be discarded or left behind.

Pray the Rosary this week for people who are seriously ill and all who care for them. As always pray for peace and the safety of military personnel serving abroad.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman

We're one month into the new year and only a couple of weeks from Ash Wednesday, and I think this is a great opportunity for self-reflection.

- How are things going?
- · What do my relationships look like?
- Where am I at spiritually, emotionally, physically?

Zeroing in on the spiritual aspect (big surprise, I know) I find myself wanting to reconsider where I stand in relation to sin. My own personal sinfulness that I often try to reason away or ignore because, well, pride. One of the practices we employ during Lent is sacrifice as a means to detachment. So before we can really make a meaningful sacrifice (and one we commit ourselves to honoring) we need to reflect on the sins to which we are most attached.

St. Francis de Sales taught that to really live a devout life, we needed to root out not just sin, but the affection for sin. St. John in his First Letter tells us the "antichrist" is anything that is not of God's spirit. It's the little things that pull us further from God on a daily, weekly, monthly basis.

As we prepare for Lent, let's reflect on which sins we are most loathe to detach from, and ask the Holy Spirit for the grace and fortitude to go to Confession and recommit ourselves to following Christ completely.


