MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

BLESSED ARE THEY WHO FOLLOW THE LAW OF THE LORD

Today's Gospel continues Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount." Like other teachers (Rabbis) in his day, he comments on the Law of Moses, the heart of which we know as "The Ten Commandments." Moses had received the Law from God and no

part of it was to be changed. Jesus teaches with the authority of God himself: "But I say to you..." His comments on what we know as the fifth, sixth and eighth commandments take us beyond the mere letter of the law to the values each one enshrines: human life and dignity, sexual purity in thought and action and the indissolubility of marriage, honesty and the integrity of one's word.

Today is World Marriage Day. This observance is meant to highlight the fundamental importance of marriage in the life of the Church and society in general. The Church defines marriage as a "covenant by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life...which is ordered by its very nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring." (Cf. Canon 1055, §1) Pope Francis, in his 2016 Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris Lætitia*, states: "With inner joy and deep comfort, the Church looks to families who remain faithful to the teachings of the Gospel, encouraging them and thanking them for the testimony they offer. For they bear witness, in a credible way, to the beauty of marriage as indissoluble and perpetually faithful." (n. 89)

Although the secular culture seems to have abandoned this marriage ideal, Pope Francis goes on to say: "In order to avoid all misunderstanding, I would point out that in no way must the Church desist from proposing the full ideal of marriage, God's plan in all its grandeur." (n. 307) If the Church were to abandon this ideal, knowledge of God's plan for marriage would soon be forgotten.

Probably no marriage is ideal. This is because human beings are not perfect. Nevertheless we are bound by the law of Christ. Pope Francis says: "For the law is itself a gift of God which points out the way, a gift for everyone without exception; it can be followed with the help of grace." (n. 295) Grace is the key, which is why Christ raised marriage to the dignity of a sacrament.

Sometimes, however, marriages fail. This is always sad and affects every member of the family. When a husband and wife can no longer live together, the Church even permits divorce in order to protect the civil rights and obligations of family members. Nevertheless, in keeping with Christ's teaching in today's Gospel, divorce does not dissolve a valid marriage bond and the parties are not free to enter another marriage. However if the marriage is found to be "unlawful"—to use Jesus' words in today's Gospel—or "invalid" according to the Church's criteria today, the parties can be free to enter another marriage. The process for making this determination is the responsibility of a diocese's matrimonial tribunal and the result may be a declaration of nullity.

Pray the Rosary this week for the families of our parishes, especially those who are experiencing any kind of turmoil. As always pray for peace and the safety of military personnel serving abroad.



Between our two parishes last Saturday, a group of 16 children received their first ever absolution in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This occasion led me to reflect upon my own experience with this sacrament, and how my understanding and approach to it has evolved since that first

confession at age seven.

For the majority of us, the idea of uttering our sins aloud to someone else is probably right up there with public speaking. It can be tempting for us as Catholics to see Confession as a once-a-year responsibility that we have to check off around Easter or Christmas. There's a natural sort of resistance to making ourselves vulnerable. But we know that vulnerability is a necessary component of any genuine relationship, be it romantic, familial, or otherwise. I challenge you to come at this sacrament with fresh eyes, and see it as the great gift that it is.

We have been given such an incredible opportunity to receive God's resurrecting grace, and hear those psychologically healing words: "I absolve you from your sins". Shortly before my own first reconciliation, my mother performed a demonstration for me involving a string. She told me to imagine myself on one end, and God on the other. "When we sin", she said as she pulled up the scissors, "it's like you're cutting the string between you and Him. God still loves you just as much as He ever did, but sin damages your relationship with Him, and cuts you off from His life-giving grace. However", she continued, "when we go with a humble heart to the sacrament of confession and ask for God's forgiveness we re-tie that string". As she knotted the string, she pointed out that now the two ends of the string were actually closer together. It's through our vulnerability and trust in the Lord's providence in giving us this sacrament, that we strengthen our relationship with God. Holding yourself accountable by scheduling a monthly confession is a wonderful way to take a gut-check on where you stand in relationship to Him, and to grow in trust as you embrace vulnerability.

Hello from the third-fifth classroom.



Who is a parishioner?

One who is registered and regularly participates in the liturgical life of the parish and demonstrates support of the parish mission by completing and fulfilling an annual commitment of time, treasure and talent.

To register in the Parish: We welcome anyone interested in being an active member of our parish. Please call the parish office (715-723-4088) and make an appointment with Msgr. Michael Gorman.

Baptisms: First-time parents must attend an instruction class, which is held every three months. Parents are encouraged to plan ahead and attend the class prior to the birth of their child. Please contact the parish office to sign up for the class.

Marriages: Couples are required to contact Father at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date and BEFORE making any other arrangements or reserving a reception hall.


