



# **Message from the Pastor**

# LÆTARE IERUSALEM

Today is Lætare Sunday, from the first word in Latin of the introit antiphon, "Rejoice, Jerusalem!" We have reached the midpoint of Lent and know that the joy of Easter is not far off. The liturgy expresses this joy this weekend by the symbols of light and oil found in the readings, and by fading the penitential purple of the Lenten vestments to a more festive rose. The light

and oil, symbols used in the baptismal liturgy, Michael J. Gorman represent the enlightenment of faith, which the man born blind displays in today's Gospel, by which we, the baptized, are to live "as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth." (Second Reading) The oil used to anoint David as king in the First Reading is a foreshadowing of the sacred chrism, the oil of consecration, used in the baptism of infants, in the administration of confirmation, and in the ordination of priests and bishops. Just as "the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David" when he was anointed by the prophet Samuel (First Reading), so God gives his Holy Spirit to the baptized, who share Christ's royal prophetic priesthood.

Today's Gospel is the second of the three long passages from John's Gospel originally intended for the instruction of the catechumens preparing for baptism at Easter. It reminds both the catechumens and us, the community of believers, that God's gift of faith enables us to acknowledge Jesus as the Christ, eliciting from us a profession of faith. The guestioning of the man's parents about whether or not he had actually been blind from birth was due to the belief that, if one had lost his sight, he could possibly regain it by human intervention; but if he had never had sight, only God could give it. The healing of the man born blind, therefore, had to have been an act of God. It is the man born blind himself, then, who proclaims the point of the story: "It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, he would not be able to do anything." (John 9:32-33) This passage contrasts the insight of faith with the blindness of those who refuse to believe. Let us recall these verses from the prologue of John's Gospel, from the passage read in the Mass of Christmas Day: "[T]he light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5); and: "The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world." (John 1:9)

Throughout the season of Lent the Church exhorts us to "turn away from sin and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15) The sacrament of penance is the most powerful means of persevering in this resolve, because its grace is the result of Christ's obedient sacrifice for the redemption of the world. The Lenten discipline of prayer and penance finds its completion in a good confession and act of contrition. The prayer of absolution frees us from the sinful entanglements into which we fall. It renews in us the cleansing and life-giving waters of baptism we call "sanctifying grace." Take advantage of the opportunities for confession and the conversion it affords. Remember also to participate in Operation Rice Bowl or in some other charitable cause this Lent.

We celebrate two special feast days this week. The first is the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Husband of Mary and Patron of the Universal Church, on Monday, March 20, transferred from March 19 because it falls on Sunday this year. We will celebrate this Solemnity at the 5:30 evening Mass on Monday. The second is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on Saturday, March 25. This is the feast of the Incarnation of God the Son as man through the free cooperation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In observance of this Solemnity there will be a Mass at St. Charles at 8:30 on Saturday morning.

Pray the rosary again this week for people estranged from the Church, that they may seek reconciliation through a good confession. Pray for those preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation at Easter. Pray for peace in the Ukraine and for all who are working to assist the refugees and victims of the war and recent earthquakes; and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. — Monsignor Gorman 2

Greetings!

It would seem, based on a number of things the Lord has put in my path of late, that He wants me to reflect on spiritual dryness. We all know this, even if we haven't put a label on it. It's the, "I pray but I don't feel God's presence," or, "I've hit a spiritual wall and prayer is blah" feeling. Sound familiar? In response to this I'd like to share some recent wisdom that I've found to be of help. Spiritual dryness is a guaranteed part of our spiritual journey because God is a gentleman. What do I mean by this? In the words of C.S. Lewis in The Screwtape Letters, "He [God] cannot ravish. He can only woo." If God were to be constantly revealing Himself to us, in all His glory, our choosing Him would not be done freely. It would be impossible to say no. And we know, from the beginning, that God desires the free assent of our will. He desires our love, which cannot be forced. Accordingly, He will allow us, much like a child learning to walk, some struggle in the spiritual life. No doubt you've heard of great saints who dealt with many years of spiritual struggle (e.g. St. Teresa of Calcutta), as this was the means God chose to bring them closer to Himself.

Now I realize this might not be all that comforting, but I think it's important to see that dryness isn't a purposeless struggle. It has the function of testing our hearts. We know that uttering a prayer in a season of profound dullness is done out of love and obedience to God. If we're only praying when it "feels good", we are guilty of what St. John of the Cross called "spiritual gluttony." I've 100% fallen into this trap on multiple occasions in my life. "If only this Adoration hour could feel like the one I had x amount of years ago, that was when I was really in touch with the Lord." Be on guard my friends, because this is the enemy looking to undermine our current relationship with God. We will experience spiritual dryness, but we can see this as an opportunity to obey our God out of sheer love. In the words of C.S. Lewis' main character, Screwtape (a demon attempting to damn a young man):

"Our cause is never more in danger than when a human, no longer desiring, but still intending, to do our Enemy's [God's] will, looks round upon a universe from which every trace of Him seems to have vanished, and asks why he has been forsaken, and still obeys."

This life is a battle, but we are not alone. Keep fighting, aka keep praying!

# Blessing of the Easter Basket

Families may bring a decorative basket containing a sampling of Easter foods to St. Peter Church for a blessing at 10:00 AM Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin. The sampling of foods in the basket have a symbolic meaning:

- Eggs, symbolize life and Christ's resurrection
- · Bread, symbolic of Jesus
- Lamb (or a meat) represents Christ
- Salt, represents purification
- Horseradish, symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ
- Ham, symbolic of great joy and abundance.

In the Polish tradition the food blessed in the church remains untouched until either Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning.




