#### MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

#### **DO YOU BELIEVE THIS?**

This is the question Jesus poses directly to Martha in today's gospel, after explaining to her: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." In the face of the death of her brother, Lazarus, four days before, Martha does Monsignor not hesitate to reply: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the

one who is coming into the world." In last Sunday's Gospel the man born blind whom Jesus had healed is asked, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" (John 9:35) After he asks who he is and Jesus replies that he is the Son of Man, the man says: "I do believe, Lord." (John 9:38) These professions of faith model for the catechumens to be baptized at Easter and for us who will renew our baptismal promises the answers to the guestions which will be posed to us: "Do you believe in God, the Father almighty...? Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord...? Do you believe in the Holy Spirit...?" Our response to these questions should be a sincere and enthusiastic, "I do!" Like the townspeople of the woman at the well in the Gospel two Sundays ago, we believe not simply on the testimony of others; now this faith is our own, "for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world." (John 4:42)

Today's Gospel completes the trilogy of gospels intended specifically for the instruction of the catechamens preparing for baptism at Easter. New life is Christ's promise to those who are bathed in the "living water" (cf. John 4:10) after having been enlightened by faith. Furthermore it fulfills in a way beyond imagining the prophecy first spoken to the Jews in exile in the sixth century before Christ: "O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them." (First Reading) The ability of Jesus to call Lazarus forth from the tomb reveals him to be the Lord of life. Lazarus, however, was called back to earthly life and one day would die again. Nevertheless it invites us to look to Jesus' own resurrection, through his dialogue with Martha, as the source of hope for our own resurrection to eternal life: "If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you." (Second Reading)

Throughout the season of Lent the Church exhorts us to "turn away" from sin and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15) The sacrament of penance is the most powerful means of persevering in this resolve, because its grace is the result of Christ's obedient sacrifice for the redemption of the world. The Lenten discipline of prayer and penance finds its completion in a good confession and act of contrition. The prayer of absolution frees us from the sinful entanglements into which we fall. It renews in us the cleansing and life-giving waters of baptism we call "sanctifying grace." The sacrament of penance is available at St. Charles on Mondays at 5:00 PM and Saturdays at 3:00 PM, and at St. Peter on Saturdays at 6:00 PM. On page 4 of this bulletin you will find the schedule of additional confession times this week and next. The priests of the city will gather for a penance service at Saint Charles Church at 6:30 PM on Thursday, March 30. This will be the only communal penance service offered in the city this Lent. Take advantage of these opportunities or any others to complete your preparation for Easter by making a good confession. Easter will be here before we know it!

Pray the rosary again this week for people estranged from the Church, that they may seek reconciliation through a good confession. Pray for those preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation at Easter. Pray for peace in the Ukraine and for all who are working to assist the refugees and victims of the war and recent earthquakes; and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman

Happy Sunday (or Saturday evening)!

I'm going to drop a word here that tends to make all of us tense up a bit; obedience. It's a virtue we likely avoid asking for on account of our fallen nature. And yet, Jesus makes it incredibly clear by the mystery of His life on earth that it is indispensable for those who want to follow after Him.

Jesus took on our humanity in obedience to the Father. He lived a guiet, ordinary life with his mother and legal father as a devout Jewish carpenter. In the words of the Catechism, this life was "the temporal image of his filial obedience to his Father in heaven. The everyday obedience of Jesus to Joseph and Mary both announced and anticipated the obedience of Holy Thursday: 'Not my will. . . '." The way He lived anticipated the vocation Jesus always knew he would fulfill through obedience.

Prior to His agony in Gethsemane, Jesus revealed himself as the "New Adam" while being tempted in the desert. The devil propositions Jesus with temptations of worldly wealth and power, the things many Jews hoped the long-awaited Messiah would possess. Jesus, however, is steadfast in obedience to the Father. The evil one is conquered by obedience to God's will.

This, like all of His teachings, applies to us as well. We conquer temptation through adherence to the Father's will for us. It is one of, if not the most, difficult parts of living out our faith. But it's what leads us to overcoming evil and becoming saints. As we get closer to Holy Week, I invite you to meditate with me on how our everyday lives are calling us to practice greater obedience, so that we can join Christ in saying, "Not my will, but thine be done".

We also are encouraged to venerate the Divine Mercy Image and perform acts of mercy through deed, word, or prayer.



## Holy Week, Abortion, and the Wisconsin Supreme Court Race

The PBS Wisconsin headline on February 22 got right to the point: "National debate over abortion turns to Wisconsin Supreme Court race." It was referring to the election that will take place on Tuesday, April 4.

It is ironic that this debate – about whether Wisconsin law should continue to protect the lives of unborn children, as it currently does – will culminate in a State Supreme Court election that falls between the Feast of the Annunciation (March 25), when Jesus became Incarnate in the womb of Mary, and Good Friday (April 7), when he was put to death on the Cross.

Media coverage of the two Supreme Court candidates and their philosophies is widespread, and abortion has been the constant focal point. *Our challenge is to inform ourselves*.
