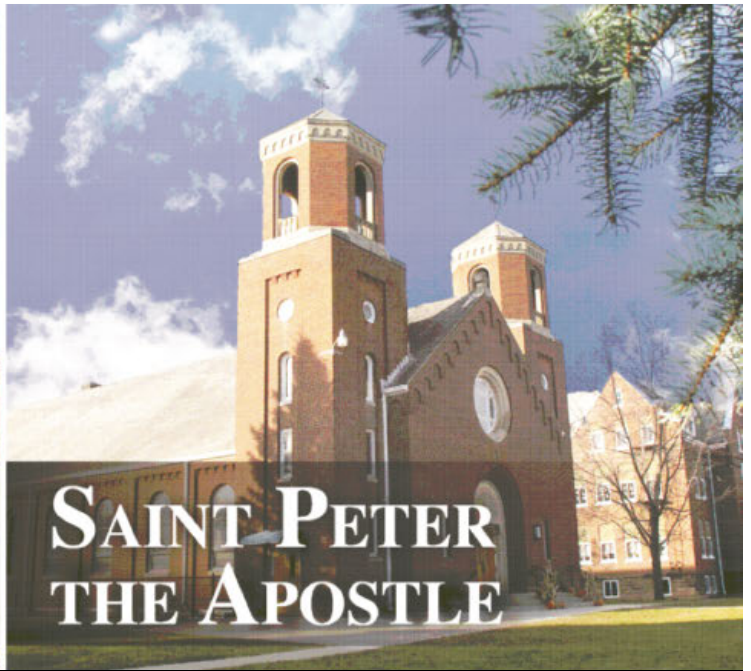

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS

Today we celebrate the second of the three solemnities of the Easter season, the Ascension of the Lord. The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles tell us that the risen Jesus appeared to his disciples over a period of about forty days before ascending into heaven in their sight. The ascension of Jesus, however, did not mark his departure from this world, but his presence in a new way. As Saint Paul states in today's Second Reading: "[God the Father] put all things beneath [Christ's] feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way." Far from abandoning us, Christ's ascension into glory has made it possible for him to dwell in us, who are his body, the living stones who are the Church. Christ's presence is not confined to the dimensions of an individual human body, but "fills all things in every way." Pope Saint Leo the Great, in a sermon on the Ascension, said:

And so our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments... The truth is that the Son of Man was revealed as Son of God in a more perfect and transcendent way once he had entered into his Father's glory; he now began to be indescribably more present in his divinity to those from whom he was further removed in his humanity.

This reminds us that we must be careful not to imagine the Ascension in terms too spatial. Saint Augustine, in a sermon on the Ascension of the Lord, said:

He did not leave heaven when he came down to us; nor did he withdraw from us when he went up again into heaven. The fact that he was in heaven even while he was on earth is borne out by his own statement: "No one has ever ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man, who is in heaven." [John 3:13]

In the *Communicantes* of Eucharistic Prayer I for the Ascension, we hear that Christ "placed at the right hand of [the Father's] glory our weak human nature, which he had united to himself." By his incarnation he became one of us, taking upon himself our weak human nature, even to the point of suffering, death and burial. By his resurrection he won the victory over death for humanity. He ascended into glory with his humanity intact and literally has taken human nature to new heights, for "by this wondrous union we, too, are made eternal." (Christmas Preface III) Today's feast is another movement in God's outreach to us in Christ, drawing us to his bosom in the embrace of sheer love.

This Sunday members of Goldsmith Council 974 of the Knights of Columbus are putting on a pancake breakfast in our fellowship hall. This is also a recruiting event for men to join this premier Catholic men's group. Each year they give away tens of thousands of dollars to charitable organizations, parishes, Catholic schools, and pro-life causes locally; and through their state and national organization, they support the work of the Church nationally and globally as well. There will be information available at the breakfast for any men interested in learning more and wanting to become a member. They are also giving away Tootsie Rolls at all our parishes for a freewill offering, which assists people with intellectual disabilities—just another example of the charitable work they do.

Pray the rosary this week for students who are graduating from any level of schooling, that they may always put to good use what they have learned. Pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and for those from our parishes who have recently received their first communion or confirmation. Pray also for good weather for the spring planting and growing season. As always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. — *Monsignor Gorman*

Hello,

Maybe it's because we're coming off of Confirmation over here, or the upcoming feast of Pentecost, but the Holy Spirit is on my heart and mind. I didn't actively direct my prayers to the Spirit until college, and even then it wasn't until afterwards that I began to acknowledge the third Person of the Trinity in my personal prayer. Huge mistake on my part. The vast majority of us who are a part of this parish are living as laypeople. We don't have built-in holy hours like those blessed with religious vocations, and often we feel our lives are too chaotic to make consistent time for the Lord. This, of course, is not an excuse for failing to make an effort, but is a reality of living in the world with kids and jobs and mortgages.

So what are we to do? I'm going to suggest something that far holier and wiser people have already figured out (ahem, St. Francis de Sales): allow God to sanctify you through your daily life.

How do we do this? Ask, offer, and accept.

First: **ask** God to be present. Invite the Holy Spirit into whatever you're doing—be it gardening, working out, sleeping, or filling in a spreadsheet.

Second: **offer** that time to God. Give Him the conversation you're having with a struggling friend, the laundry you're folding, or the boring meeting.

Third: **accept** whatever He gives to you, acknowledging He can use all for the good, whether or not we see it ourselves.

Every moment of your life can become an opportunity to worship God, and it all begins with asking the Holy Spirit to move in your life, to be present to you. I've begun to do this, and I invite you to join me! I pray it'll bear fruit in our lives, and the lives of those we love.
