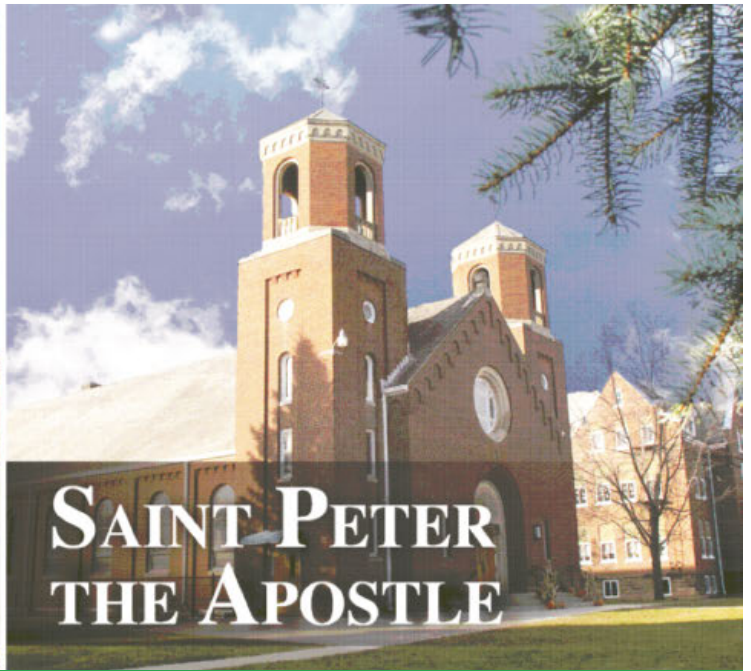

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Msgr. Michael J. Gorman

DO NOT BE AFRAID

Three times in today's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples—and us—not to be afraid. In last Sunday's Gospel we heard Jesus choose the twelve apostles and then send them out on mission to proclaim, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand." Between last Sunday's Gospel and today's passage, 17 verses have been omitted. Those verses warn of the opposition, betrayal and persecution the disciples may experience in fulfilling their mission. It is on the heels of those warnings that today's Gospel begins, "Fear no one." That exhortation is then followed by the assurance of God's love for each one and his power to save. It is foreshadowed by Jeremiah's peril and his trust in the God who has become his "mighty champion." (First Reading) It echoes the beatitude, "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you (falsely) because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven. Thus they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matthew 5:11-12) It anticipates the first words of the Risen Lord to the women who came to the tomb, "Do not be afraid." (Matthew 28:10)

Perhaps there is presented here the heart of the gospel message. There is no easy way to heaven and alone we cannot attain it. Therefore we must not rely on ourselves alone, but have faith in God, who "delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." (Colossians 1:13-14) This, of course, is God's grace, which overflowed for the many in God's gracious gift to us of his Son, Jesus Christ. (Cf. today's Second Reading.) The cost and sacrifices required to be truly Christian are great, but well worth it. The reward is eternal life.

This is Father Hokamp's last weekend with us. He is leaving on Tuesday to accompany a group of FOCUS Missionaries to Mexico, returning on July 10. Then he will probably stay some of the time at St. Charles Rectory until he leaves for his new assignment in Rome later in August. On July 4 we will welcome our new associate pastor, newly-ordained Father Alex Kren. These days of transition are both exciting and challenging for all of us.

FOCUS stands for Fellowship of Catholic University Students. FOCUS missionaries are on 193 university campuses in the United States, including several university campuses in our diocese. Their purpose is to launch college students into lifelong Catholic mission. They meet the students in friendship, inviting them into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and walking with them as they pursue lives of virtue and excellence. They do this through Bible studies, outreach events, mission trips and everyday accompaniment. Marcus Schoch, originally from St. Peter Parish, is the East Area Director for FOCUS and lives near Augusta, Georgia. Our parishes support his work with regular contributions.

Pray the rosary this week for our four newly-ordained priests. Pray for the seminarians studying for our diocese and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace.

A blessed Lord's Day to all of you,

As a response to the culture at large this month, I've seen many Catholics emphasize the importance of humility. Now this is certainly the antithesis to the attitude that is promoted by the world, and for that reason, gets a bad rap. In the eyes of many, people who embody this virtue are deemed weak, simpering or powerless. This is a misunderstanding.

According to St. Thomas Aquinas, humility "consists in keeping oneself within one's own bounds, not reaching out to things above one, but submitting to one's superior" (Summa Contra Gent., bk. IV, ch. lv). In other words, a humble person knows who they are— their strengths along with their weaknesses, and submits all of it to God. As much as designers like to tell children, "you can do anything," we do have limits. It is only with God that all things are possible, and this is something we can have total confidence in.

It's somewhat paradoxical isn't it? We can be supremely confident in our littleness and God's unfailing love for us. St. Thérèse of the Little Flower exemplifies this humble confidence beautifully, in the pattern of our Blessed Mother. The greatest things are accomplished in us when we "step aside" and let God work through us. Her wildflower metaphor is a lovely explanation of the importance of humility in the world.

The splendor of the rose and the whiteness of the lily do not take away the perfume of the little violet or the delightful simplicity of the daisy. If all flowers wanted to be roses, nature would lose her springtime beauty... And so it is in the world of souls, Jesus' garden. Perfection consists in doing His will, in being what He wills us to be (*The Story of a Soul*).

There is true freedom in acknowledging who you are, the good, the bad, and the ugly, and offering all of it to God. He wants your heroic moments and your sinful moments. Let's submit them all, and trust that He will do with us exactly as He wills, for our benefit. 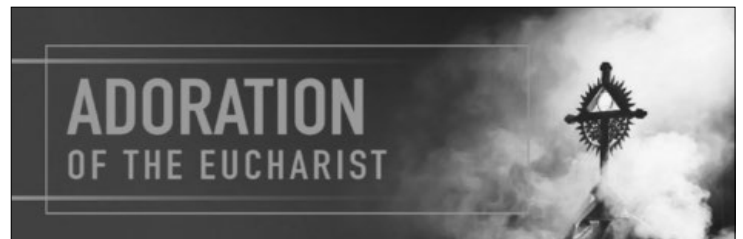
