



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

WHO IS THIS WHOM EVEN WIND AND SEA OBEY?

The episode in today's Gospel of Jesus rebuking the wind and quieting the sea ends with the disciples asking the question, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" Today's First Reading gives us a clue to the answer to this question as God proclaims to Job that he alone governs the forces of nature. The answer is given in the very first verse of Mark's gospel: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." The rest of Mark's gospel, then, should be read with this in mind: Jesus is the Christ, the long-awaited Messiah or Anointed of the Lord; and he is the Son of God, whom we know to be God the Son, the second Person of the Blessed Trinity, become man. This affirmation is something that the disciples in Mark's gospel never quite make. As Mark portrays the disciples, they never quite get it. Perhaps Mark intended to show how much they were changed by their experience of the Risen Lord. The only explicit affirmation of Jesus' divinity in Mark's gospel comes from one of the centurions who witnessed his crucifixion: "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mark 15:39) Apart from that, for Mark it is the power Jesus demonstrates in his miracles and the authority with which he speaks that form the basis for our profession of faith in him.

The Bishops of the Milwaukee Province, comprised of the five dioceses in Wisconsin, have decreed an increase in the recommended offerings for weddings and funerals: \$100 for weddings and \$75 for funerals. This represents an increase of \$25 in each case. They have also decreed an increase in the offering for a Mass intention from \$10 to \$20. Both of these go into effect on July 1. This is not retroactive so that offerings already given are not affected. Personally I believe this increase in Mass offerings is excessive and unnecessary. All offerings for sacraments and Mass intentions are freewill offerings and may not be refused regardless of the amount. In our diocese the offerings for sacraments go into our respective parishes' fund for works of charity and are used for that purpose. Mass offerings go to the priest who offers the Mass and are considered part of the priest's compensation in addition to his salary.

Some may wonder what has happened to the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel we have been saying at the end of Mass. This was a practice requested by Bishop Callahan. Our new Bishop Battersby is not requesting it. I have decided to discontinue it because it is usually prayed with the Rosary and other prayers said before Mass. Praying it after Mass is not only repetitious, but seems to imply that St. Michael is more powerful than the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass which has just been offered. Like the Rosary this prayer is a private devotion and more properly belongs outside of and before the Mass.

June 30 marks the end of our fiscal year, which is only a week away. As you can see from the financial report on page 5 of the bulletin, we are inching toward our goals for the Diocesan Annual Appeal. We are within \$4,600 of our goal at St. Charles and \$1,215 at St. Peter. With more donors coming through in these final weeks, especially those who have not yet given, we can certainly reach our targets. Any other special end-of-the-year contributions will be greatly appreciated to help us meet our financial obligations. Thank you for your generous support of our parishes.

Pray the rosary this week for Father David Nowicki, the new priest ordained for our diocese yesterday, June 22. He will become the new associate pastor at Holy Ghost, Notre Dame and St. Bridget on July 2. Pray for Father Ethan Hokamp and Father Brandon Guenther, who will begin new assignments that same day: Father Hokamp in Tomah and Father Guenther in Prairie du Chien. Pray for the seminarians studying for our diocese and, as always, pray for peace.

A theme in my current season of life reflected in our Scriptures today is this: God wants us to know Him as provider. It sounds simple, but like so many other things, we forget to lean on Him as the *only* one who can provide us with what we need. We entertain an illusion of self-sufficiency that is sometimes only exposed when something like suffering or tragedy brings us to our knees. Christ is the Alpha and the Omega. All things were created through Him; as we hear in the second reading, new things have come from Him. This “newness” is the opportunity to be born of Spirit and Truth, to live in perfect harmony with our Creator. We can’t grasp this on our own. It’s gift, freely given and on us to accept.

One other point: it’s also easy to feel like the list of what we need is endless. Our culture promotes this idea through every available channel. No matter your income, this nagging feeling can prey upon you. But Jesus wants us to remember that all who are heavy-laden with burdens can find rest in Him. He *will* bring us to our desired haven. True peace is found when we let go of comparison and anxiety and listen to His words as He speaks them into our hearts.

Today, let’s pray to the God who both formed and calms the sea for trust in His identity as a good Father who provides for us, His beloved children.

Over the next few weeks, we will share more information as we follow the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage to Indianapolis, Indiana, for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress July 17-21.

Last week I stated that we are part of the Marian route from the north. The Marian route is named for its visit to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion, formerly Our Lady of Good Help. This is the first and only approved Marian Apparition site in the United States. This is fitting, because the very first Eucharistic Pilgrimage was made by our Blessed Mother who traveled with the Body of Christ growing in her womb. Just as Mary followed Jesus perfectly throughout his earthly life, pilgrims will journey closely with Our Lord from May 2024 to July 2024. As of Thursday, June 13, pilgrims are in the presence of Jesus in the Diocese of Green Bay. This website allows you to keep track of where the pilgrimage is on any given day. There is a map that will show you the routes for the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route (East), St. Juan Diego Route (South), and the St. Junipero Serra Route (West). Even if you were not able to attend *the Answer*, you have an opportunity to be a part of the pilgrimage virtually. When Jesus gave us the gift of the Eucharist, he gave us a new way to walk alongside him.
