

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

I was EXTREMELY pleased with Ash Wednesday Mass attendance and I do firmly believe that Lent is off to a stellar beginning at St. Benedict Parish! Weekend Mass attendance has also been steadily improving in recent weeks, and weekday Mass numbers and participation in stations of the cross is promising as well.

Thank-you also for your generous contributions to the people and nation of Ukraine as over \$2,000.00 was collected on Ash Wednesday! As I type up this bulletin article, the number of displaced people in Ukraine due to hostilities by the Russian Federation has resulted in one million refugees to Poland and nearby European countries.

Unfortunately, this war is still in its early stages, and only God knows how many more people will be killed, injured and/or forced to flee homes and communities undergoing massive collateral damage due to the fighting so characteristic of modern warfare.

Whether you are able to contribute financially to Catholic Charities Relief Services or not, please continue to pray for the situation in Ukraine. My heart goes out to all directly affected by the violence; and I am deeply concerned as to what other far-reaching consequences may be due to the aggression exhibited by the Russian Federation.

On a much more joyful and "normal" note, Deacon Nick and I will be conducting training/refresher sessions after all three Masses for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion *next* weekend March 19-20th.

This is intended for all those who were extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion prior to the pandemic, in addition to those who are now interested in distributing the Eucharist during Mass and/or bringing the Body of Christ to the homebound and residents of nursing home/assisted living facilities. Part of the training will consist of a commissioning of new extraordinary ministers should any appear. Please note that one must be a Roman Catholic in good standing with the Church to be an extraordinary Eucharistic minister.

Honestly speaking, I was open to reinstating extraordinary ministers last May when Archbishop Jackels granted pastors and pastoral life coordinators the ability to make decisions on the local level regarding Covid mitigation strategies. But summer flew by quickly and new variants of the Coronavirus kept emerging and I thought it would be prudent to just stay the course, so to speak, of distributing the Eucharist myself in addition to Deacon Nick or Fr. Knipper when they were able to be present at our Masses. Continued on page 4...

GIVE THE GIFT OF AN IRA ROLLOVER

Giving an IRA Rollover Gift to St. Benedict Parish/School makes sense this year!

Beginning January 1, 2020, if you were born after July 1, 1949, and have an IRA, you must take annual IRA Required
Minimum Distributions (RMD) when you turn 72. If you were born on or before July 1, 1949, you are still required to take your required minimum distribution at age 70 ½.

You must take the distribution whether you need the money for living expenses or not. If you do not need those proceeds to make financial ends meet, then we ask you to consider giving those proceeds directly to St. Benedict Parish/School.

By doing so, you pay **NO** income tax on this RMD. More importantly, by doing so you help continue the important spiritual work of your parish/school. It is important to first contact your IRA administrator to see how you can "roll over" into tax savings while helping support your spiritual mission. There is a specific process and forms that need to be used and they can help you through those simple steps.

We have many parishioners giving to the parish this way! It is great for them and great for the parish! Thank you to all who do "IRA Rollover" gifts to St. Benedict Parish/School!!

As of the writing of this "spiel," I have no plans to offer the cup containing the Precious Blood of Christ, but *will* have one additional Eucharistic Minister distributing the Body of Christ when Deacon Nick is assisting at Sunday Mass, and two Eucharistic Ministers will be needed when I am the only clergy present on a Sunday Mass and/or when we have large numbers of people present, such as occurs often at weddings and funerals.

Of course I realize that as with the other liturgical roles such as ushers, Mass Servers, etc., it will take come time for people to remember to sign up and/or volunteer when no one has actually committed themselves for a given Mass. This is natural after a two-year absence of extraordinary ministers at our parish.

One final, and very important, policy I would like to remind everyone about is that I ask everyone who has been or wishes to receive Holy Communion on their tongues to approach me, Deacon Nick or Fr. Knipper to do so.

As always, *thank-you* for your patience and support during this two-year ordeal. That's all for now, have a great week and don't forget to move your clocks ahead one hour this weekend; it's that time of the year again (pun intended)! More to come!


