Blessed is the elder brother who had been a good steward all along, but blessed, too, is the prodigal who had to lose all he had in order to understand the value of what he'd been given.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

This Fourth Sunday of Lent I am offering the sacrament of the anointing of the sick for parishioners who are of advanced years and/or those who are afflicted with chronic illnesses especially cancer, Parkinson's Disease, diabetes, heart disease, etc.

Furthermore, this sacrament of healing is intended for those who are anticipating or recovery from surgery and other medical procedures. Finally, I just wish to remind all those who struggle with anxiety and depression that you, too, are appropriate candidates for anointing of the sick, in addition to those who have serious addictions to substances or pastimes that enslave the human person such as alcohol, drugs, pornography and gambling.

The liturgy of the anointing and the actual reception of this sacrament will occur immediately after all three of our weekend Masses. Please note that there will be no drive-up options offered. For those who are not comfortable returning to church or will be otherwise indisposed this weekend to be anointed, I am happy to oblige individual requests for anointing of the sick at your private homes, in my office or in church. Just contact the parish office in order to make an appointment with me.

Life is short, therefore it is a laudable Catholic practice to be somewhat proactive in receiving this sacrament; especially prior to surgery and in our twilight years. One final point I wish to make is that I plan to offer the anointing of the sick to our parishioners who are residents of Wellington Place, Aase Haugen Home, and Eastern Star on their respective Thursdays once we enter into the month of April.

Finally, while I am on the topic of sacraments of healing and grace, one of the main findings of the recent parish survey exercise was the amount of negative "baggage" that many parishioners have regarding the sacrament of reconciliation.

While I have been pleasantly surprised and frankly, very impressed with the quality and frequency of confessions at St. Benedict's these past four years as your pastor, I am also realistic enough to know that many tend to shy away from this sacrament across the Catholic ministerial tapestry.

For one, it is never easy to admit that we have sinned and done wrong, yet we are all sinners desperately in need of God's mercy, love and forgiveness. For many people even the simple three-word phrase "I am sorry" is almost impossible to ever utter because it takes humility to admit that we have hurt someone; (often the ones we know and love the most) either intentionally or unintentionally.

FATHER HERTGS CONTINUED

In short, admitting wrongdoing, cultivating a repentant heart, seeking forgiveness and gently pursuing authentic reconciliation requires the humility to see ourselves as we truly are, before God and our fellow human beings. Yet having stated all that, I also am fully aware that more than a few Catholics may have had a negative or overly harsh experience in the confessional that may still haunt some even decades after it transpired.

The longer I am ordained and live out my priesthood, the more I am aware of just how human we priests are, and that we too have our personality foibles that may come out at the most inopportune occasions, but can literally turn people off from the Church in general, if not reconciliation in particular, as God's forgiveness is mediated through the priest acting as His instrument.

The Church has come to better recognize this as well in more recent years, and I can personally and happily attest to the fact that seminaries have indeed come a *long way* in actually training its future priests to be compassionate and pastorally attuned to manifesting the love of God.

In short, modern seminary formation includes extensive practice in hearing confessions integrating moral theology into our overall pastoral formation. This is crucial as the priest's demeanor, availability, and even the penances assigned can help or hinder the penitent's experience of forgiveness, healing and overall growth in conversion.

So especially for those who have been away from confession for several years, PLEASE give this sacrament and the Church that offers it another chance!


