

#### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

Can you believe that two weeks from now is Easter Sunday? I can't either! As the lyrics from the March 1977 Steve Miller Band hit song said, "Time keeps on slipping into the future."

In any case, I have some fabulous and hopeful news from the latter part of the month of March that is another huge step forward in the hopeful pursuit of normalcy. I was going to share with all of you in last week's "spiel," but ran out of space, which is one of the main reasons why I generally conclude my weekly bulletin column with the upbeat and anticipatory phrase *more to come!* 

I was summoned to the Winneshiek Medical Center a couple of weeks ago to visit a couple of parishioners who were patients at aforementioned healthcare facility. Relatives of the patients made the request for my visit, which has been the mode of operating since March of 2020. Upon completion of my visit, I asked the medical personnel at the nurse's station if Deacon Nick and I could once again perform weekly visits to the Roman Catholic patients at the hospital as we did prior to March of 2020. The staff present said that was fine and now permissible by current hospital guidelines (praised be Jesus Christ).

A reminder is in order here that prior to the pandemic Deacon Nick typically visited the Winneshiek Medical Center Monday evenings prior to Benediction at church and I tried to visit either on Wednesday or Thursday, depending upon how demanding my week was. Sometimes Fridays would serve as hospital visit day as I could conveniently stop by after school Mass. Of course Deacon Nick and I will abide by whatever visitor protocols the hospital has in place and I always have my anointing kit with me.

My practice is to leave a business card behind with the patient and hospital staff as a record that the individual indeed received the sacrament of the sick and/or the Apostolic Pardon where appropriate and requested. In this manner hospital staff can enter this into the Catholic person's medical chart as well. The business cards also serve as a low-tech and effective means to assure family members and friends that their loved one was indeed visited by clergy who also represent the Church. Honestly speaking, I have utilized business cards in all my prior parish assignments in fourteen years of priesthood and I always feel *extra-professional* whenever I have an occasion to share them with people!

Visiting the sick is one of the corporal works of mercy and I am so grateful to once again have freedom of movement so to speak in being able to visit every week without having to place an additional burden upon patients and their loved ones to contact the parish office to specifically request this. Yet having stated all that, if you or someone you know is hospitalized before or after the weekly visit, please do not hesitate to contact me and I will be happy to stop by and/or confer the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. That's all for now, have a great week! MORE TO COME!

#### ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you. Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence! You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Yet we have strayed from that path of peace. We have forgotten the lesson learned from the tragedies of the last century, the sacrifice of the millions who fell in two world wars. We have disregarded the commitments we made as a community of nations. We have betrayed peoples' dreams of peace and the hopes of the young. We grew sick with greed, we thought only of our own nations and their interests, we grew indifferent and caught up in our selfish needs and concerns. We chose to ignore God, to be satisfied with our illusions, to grow arrogant and aggressive, to suppress innocent lives and to stockpile weapons. We stopped being our neighbor's keepers and stewards of our common home. We have ravaged the garden of the earth with war and by our sins we have broken the heart of our heavenly Father, who desires us to be brothers and sisters. We grew indifferent to everyone and everything except ourselves. Now with shame we cry out: Forgive us, Lord!

Holy Mother, amid the misery of our sinfulness, amid our struggles and weaknesses, amid the mystery of iniquity that is evil and war, you remind us that God never abandons us, but continues to look upon us with love, ever ready to forgive us and raise us up to new life. He has given you to us and made your Immaculate Heart a refuge for the Church and for all humanity. By God's gracious will, you are ever with us; even in the most troubled moments of our history, you are there to guide us with tender love.

We now turn to you and knock at the door of your heart. We are your beloved children. In every age you make yourself known to us, calling us to conversion. At this dark hour, help us and grant us your comfort. Say to us once more: "Am I not here, I who am your Mother?" You are able to untie the knots of our hearts and of our times. In you we place our trust. We are confident that, especially in moments of trial, you will not be deaf to our supplication and will come to our aid.

That is what you did at Cana in Galilee, when you interceded with Jesus and he worked the first of his signs. To preserve the joy of the wedding feast, you said to him: "They have no wine" (*Jn* 2:3). Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded. We have forgotten our humanity and squandered the gift of peace. We opened our hearts to violence and destructiveness. How greatly we need your maternal help!

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer.

Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war.

Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation.

Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world. Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge, and teach us forgiveness.

Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons.

Queen of the Rosary, make us realize our need to pray and to love.

Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity.

Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

O Mother, may your sorrowful plea stir our hardened hearts. May the tears you shed for us make this valley parched by our hatred blossom anew. Amid the thunder of weapons, may your prayer turn our thoughts to peace. May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.

Holy Mother of God, as you stood beneath the cross, Jesus, seeing the disciple at your side, said: "Behold your son" (*Jn* 19:26). In this way he entrusted each of us to you. To the disciple, and to each of us, he said: "Behold, your Mother" (v. 27). Mother Mary, we now desire to welcome you into our lives and our history. At this hour, a weary and distraught humanity stands with you beneath the cross, needing to entrust itself to you and, through you, to consecrate itself to Christ. The people of Ukraine and Russia, who venerate you with great love, now turn to you, even as your heart beats with compassion for them and for all those peoples decimated by war, hunger, injustice and poverty.

Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.

Through your intercession, may God's mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the "Fiat", on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our "living fountain of hope", water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace.
