This is a scam! It is NOT Fr. Hertges. Please delete the text immediately and do NOT text anything back at all. Please be very leery of anything coming from Father Hertges. Father doesn't text! Look at the phone number/email address it is coming from – this is often a giveaway!

This scam is being perpetrated in Catholic parishes state wide, (personalized with both the names of both the recipient and their priest). Sometimes these come via text and other times through email. If you ever question a communication, please call the office.

In the second reading today, St. Paul reminds the Colossians that they have been raised with Christ, exhorting them to "be intent on the things above rather than on things of earth." We too, have been raised with Christ. Let us rejoice and be glad!

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

Let me begin this bulletin column by wishing you all a heartfelt Happy Easter! At the same time, let me quickly remind everyone that Easter is not just meant for Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday, *but the Church, in her wisdom, sets aside an entire span of liturgical time known as the Easter Season* which extends until Pentecost Sunday, which falls on June 5th this year.

Therefore, these days are meant to be, in a sense, an intentional indwelling; pondering and celebrating the Paschal Mystery through fifty days. This is perhaps more necessary than ever before as we live in an age of constant distractions, planned obsolescence, passwords, incessant software updates, fast food (accompanied by disposable plates and forks). For all its many conveniences, modern living shortens our attention spans and brings a certain inner emptiness that threatens, if not outright obliterates, our ability to reflect and be fully present to signs of God's presence all around us. That is why it is so important that we reflect with love, awe, and wonder what the Resurrection of Christ over two thousand years ago means for us right here and right now in 2022.

I don't know about all of you, but I found that this Lent was the quickest ever in my lived memory. I am sure Easter will fly by as well as we conclude another school year in just a few weeks and anticipate First Communions, not to mention the beginning of the wedding season.

Speaking of Easter's culmination at Pentecost Sunday; we will continue to say the *Return* Prayer after all our Masses at Church through the entire Easter Season even though the *Return* Series concluded on Thursday April 7th. This was echoed in the letters mailed to parishioners at the beginning of the Lenten Season.

All throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus came to seek the lost and we endeavor to do the same as members of the Body of Christ and members of the Church. There are still *Return* books in the office for just \$8.00 a copy for those who would like access to the material utilized in the seven-week series, but were not able to participate in the parish. I found that the videos that were shown in church follow the book exceedingly well and are pretty much word-for-word what the author and presenter, Brandon Vogt articulated in not only explaining the issue of the mass exodus of young Catholics away from the Church, but also the remedies offered to parents in drawing their child or children back.

Jesus suffered, died and rose for us all. As God's children, He lovingly and eagerly seeks a deeper relationship with us and He also works and is present through others. The same God who willingly carried the cross all the way to Calvary continues to seek us without giving up. May we, too, be willing disciples emanating the power and hope of the Resurrection to all; especially family members who have strayed away from the Church. Amen! Alleluia, Alleluia!
