### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

The new priests' assignments (effective July 12th of this year) were revealed early last week and are on the Archdiocesan website. However, I also wish to make some hard-copy versions available near the main entrances of the church. With the untimely demise of *The Witness* in October 2020 I am deeply concerned that the laity within the Archdiocese of Dubuque no longer have easy access to information and news; especially pertaining to the whereabouts of priests. You can access the Archdiocesan page here.

You will quickly notice that our Decorah Deanery is in for some changes this July, as is a significant portion of the Archdiocese with a huge percentage of priests receiving new assignments and responsibilities. Please pray for all those affected as assignments changes are a big deal for the priests involved in addition to parishes and/or academic institutions affected. I am quite happy and grateful to be remaining at St. Benedict's!

Speaking of St. Benedict Parish, we have had two baptisms in the Easter Season thus far, and I have made the decision that we will once again offer parents the option of having their children baptized *during weekend Masses* as we did in pre-pandemic times. Here again, this is presented to parents and families as an option, but will still permit baptisms outside of Mass as well. I will heed the discretion and wishes of parents as we did prior to March of 2020.

Finally, I am *deeply humbled and grateful* for how well our parish has continued to remain engaged these past two tumultuous, challenging, and downright bizarre years of the Coronavirus Pandemic, but I am firmly convinced that we have more than enough opportunities for adult and youth faith formation currently and I am not in favor of adding anything else. I fear our parish may be, or will become, a bit too "busy."

For the time being, I would like us to just remain where we are in order to catch our breath so to speak, whereby we may discern how the Spirit moves St. Benedict Parish spontaneously; especially as people have been returning to church in greater numbers, which is truly a beautiful sight to behold from my side of the altar!

I am also not ashamed to admit to anyone that I have been feeling very exhausted spiritually and physically for some months now trying to navigate these past two years; on a personal level and as your pastor. Many other people I speak with in our parish and wider community feel the same regarding their own lives. There is always a balance between being active and maintaining one's inner cloister that should be nourished and fortified by and through the Church's teaching, sacraments and very presence, but not utterly consumed by excessive programming, good and worthy as it may be.

### ...FATHER HERTGES CONTINUED

The first year of the pandemic starkly revealed just how overscheduled (and overly-controlling) our society has become, and how excessive outward activity can be a sign, or a disguise, for inner emptiness and/or a certain lack of focus or an unhealthy retreat into distractions from what our real responsibilities are.

As life is gradually becoming more "normal," I fear that there is now the tendency to fall back into this mode of being, for a variety of reasons. If the parish becomes too heavily laden with offerings, people may not have the time or energy to be genuinely salt and light with their own lives and families outside the parochial sphere.

This also applies to parish staff and volunteers of our parish overseeing the aforementioned groups and offerings. There is a difference between being an *active* parish and a *busy* parish! Balance is an integral aspect of overall discipleship; and the parish should strive to model this for people not losing sight of Martha and Mary!

I feel these words are definitely in order as we enter the month of May and just two weeks after having Faith Formation Commission and Pastoral Council meetings where I made these sentiments known. What is more, this is still my ongoing vision for our parish and remains consistent with my modification of "Leadership Night" that I made almost immediately after becoming your pastor in July of 2018.


