



FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HERTGES

I begin this week's "spiel" with a huge THANK-YOU to all who tended to my dual medical needs last week, in addition to those who offered to drop off groceries. Finally, thank-you for all your prayers as I took last week off to quarantine from Covid and convalesce from shingles.

As I mentioned in my communique last Saturday, middle age and the last two years caught up with me, as did the Chicken Pox and Coronaviruses! However, I still consider myself extremely fortunate as these have been my only two noticeable maladies since the fall of 2019. Considering the extra work, worry and all-around additional stresses of the past two years, I am not going to complain too much or loudly. Life in general, and health in particular, are two precious, fragile gifts that can be lost and/or taken away very quickly, pandemic or not. I know I have stated this in homilies and written this statement quite often in bulletin articles, but last week I too received a reminder of how true this is.

On a much different and more positive note, *this Thursday*, May 26th (the Feast of St. Philip Neri, Priest) officially, liturgically, and chronologically marks my fifteenth anniversary of ordination to the priesthood of Jesus Christ! I am already eagerly looking forward to celebrating my anniversary with you on the weekend of June 4th and 5th.

I have also reached out to the twelve parishes that comprise my four prior assignments and communicated the dates with them as well. It is always a wonderful experience to be reunited with people from previous assignments; though names have been and continue to be a major challenge of mine which has not become easier over the years, considering all the experiences I have had in a relatively short span of time. May God's will be done in all times, things and places!

I wish to close this week's bulletin column by sharing a prayer that has been very powerful and meaningful to me since receiving it in May of 2003 from some of the belongings of Fr. Giles Brom. This fellow Ossianite had been a Christian Brother for some years before being ordained to the priesthood for Peoria, Illinois in December 1996, prior to his untimely death in August of 2002; so has a special connection to me and my hometown. What is more, this particular prayer ties in priesthood, and devotionto the Blessed Mother very well, in conjunction with the month of May and my anniversary. The prayer is even more profound and moving now after fifteen years and will continue to be so as long as God permits me to minister to His people this side of Heaven. Enjoy! Have a great week!



Prayer of A Priest to Our Lady

Dear Mother Mary, Mother of the High Priest, Jesus Christ, be the Mother of this lowly priest, too! Through sacred anointing I am Another Christ, but through my faults I am only another sinner. But because you are my Mother, do not permit me to wear my priesthood in dread fear, but renew me with eager hope, unbounded confidence and holy joy. Guard me, body and soul mind and heart. Help me in a priest's own problems; in Nazareth's work, in Gethsemane's loneliness, or in Calvary's pain. Help me to be kind to the poor, the persistent, the unreasonable, because in God's eyes I am all these things myself. Light in the sanctuary of my soul the strong candles of manly piety, so that I may pray not with mere formality, but with the fervor of a vibrant faith. In the ministry turn my good will into good works. Give me a zeal that no routine can rust, a humility that no success can shatter, patience in the splinters of petty troubles, and resignation with the big crosses burden me. Mary, my Mother, you are the Health of the Sick: help me to be their friend and consoler, you are the Refuge of Sinners: let my arms be outstretched, wide as the Crucified's, to receive the repentant, because I too have needed and have known God's mercy. You are the Tower of Ivory: within your Immaculate fortress I place my priestly purity. Let my life be spotless as a gleaming altar cloth, so that each day I may without guilt take into my hands, the Child you so often held in your arms. Whisper to me that "the Mass is not just part of the day, but the heart of the day." O Mother Mary, Mediatrix of all graces, reach out some special grace this day, to each priest all over the world—to the young, the tempted, the old, the discouraged, the dying, and the poor straying shepherds who have deserted their flock. Help them and help me, O Mother of Perpetual help, and in turn I pledge you my perpetual devotion. To you I consecrate all that I have and all that I am. On the steep path of the priesthood, I pray you walk with me every step of the way. As the evening comes, hold your lamp; and at the last, lift the latch of the gate, and bring me into Heaven, a priest forever— where "forever" is eternity in the joyful company of Jesus, my Savior, and You, my Sweet Mother Mary.
