
OUR CCCC LENTEN PROJECT A PLACE OF HOPE

Our Journey with Christ

Dear folks:

Happy Palm Sunday! Happy Holy Week! This week is the highpoint of the celebrations of our journey with Christ as we walk with Him through the streets of Jerusalem to Calvary and to the tomb. As we journey with Him, we are called to pray for one another that we may be faithful.

Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Wednesday evening at Saint Boniface at 7:00 PM. Father Cletus and I will be hearing confessions in the front of the church as long as needed. Please come and celebrate the Sacrament of God's mercy and love for the world.

Consider inviting someone to join you for the liturgies of the Three Days. These sacred Three Days are the holiest and most ancient celebrations of the Church. As we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood on Holy Thursday, to the self-offering of Christ on the Cross on Good Friday, to having all still on Holy Saturday until the ancient proclamation of the Resurrection, as we rejoice with the heavenly powers at the Vigil—we are keeping the memorial of God's saving the human race through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of His Beloved Son.

Special thank you to our bulletin advertisers! This past week we were happy to host our own Gary Stang who works for LPI, the publisher of our bulletin, as he gathered support for this weekly bulletin. Please take the time to thank those businesses from our local community who support this important outreach tool. Through the efforts of LPI, we are able to produce a higher quality bulletin because of the availability of resources as well as returning a significant portion of each advertiser's funds to the parishes. Each parish receives a portion of the revenue from the advertisers.

Please pray for our second grade students and others who will receive First Communion after Easter. We have been celebrating First Communion at MIC on the Second Sunday of Easter, at Saint Boniface on the Third Sunday of Easter, at Saints Peter & Paul on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, and at Saint James on the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Please keep these young people and their families in your prayers during these weeks as they prepare to receive Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion.

The Pastoral Council of the Centered on Christ Catholic Community will be meeting on Thursday, April 21. The agenda for this meeting includes finalizing our strategic plan to be submitted to the Diocese, hearing reports from Megan Koll on the Elementary Discipleship Formation (EDF) Program and Chad Bauer on the Youth and Young Adult Discipleship Formation program, and working on the plans for our Community Picnic on Sunday, May 29.

Once again, I would like to clarify a misunderstanding that is present in some corners of our community. Each parish has its own bank accounts. MIC banks primarily at Granite Bank, Saint Boniface at the State Bank of Cold Spring, Saints Peter & Paul at Falcon Bank and Saint James at the State Bank of Cold Spring. Each parish has its own set of counters who open the envelopes, recording the amount given, and then depositing the funds into the parish account. The Community staff members record the amounts in the software program for each parish and reconcile the bank accounts with the counters' sheets at the end of the month. The Budget & Investment Committee of each parish receives a Statement of Activities and Balance Sheet at the end of each month. The treasurer-trustee reviews the bank statements and the reconciliation forms with detailed transaction reports monthly. Shared expenses between the parishes, including salaries, are split according to the percentage of registered families.




