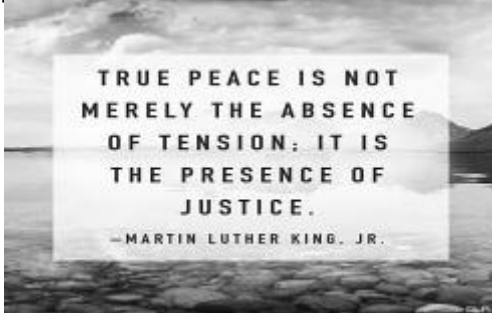

FROM FR. JOE

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

This weekend of January 12 and 13, we will be joined by Rev. David L. Delich, O.P. He will speak at all the Masses about a ministry providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.

Father Delich will share personal witness about Food for the Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another.

Fr. Delich was ordained for the Order of Preachers, the Dominicans, in 1963. He has spent many years as a Chaplain in hospitals and prisons, and as a physics and computer science teacher.

Please join me in welcoming Father Delich.

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. For a long time, this feast day was celebrated as a part of Epiphany. The celebration of Epiphany, which was always on January 6 (whether it landed on a Sunday or not) focused on three events: the coming of the Magi; the Baptism of the Lord; and the Miracle at the Wedding of Cana. The reason these three events are grouped together is because they are all examples of how Christ was revealed to the world. On the Epiphany, the Magi came from the East. This showed that the Christ came for the whole world, not just Israel. At the Baptism of the Lord (today's feast), God the Father declares to the world that Christ is His Son. Next week, we will hear the Gospel Reading of the Miracle at Cana. Here, Jesus performed His first miracle. He revealed to the world that He truly is the Christ. So today's feast is a part of this triple celebration, focusing on Christ's coming into the world. From here, Christ will go into the desert to prepare for his public ministry. What a wonderful way to end the Christmas Season, and begin the Season of Ordinary Time.

Youth Minister's Letter

Last week I had the opportunity to take an intensive course in Tucson on the Spirituality of the Church. I did not know most of the people in the course at the beginning of the 10 days, but after hours of class together each day, sharing meals, and talking about each other and what we were learning each night, I felt that I was able to not only learn about the spirituality of the Church, but to actually live it. One of the fundamental topics we learned about was that through the gift of our baptism, we are made one family. So, I should have as much concern for my church family as I do for my biological family. This is because at our baptism, we are not simply invited into a club. Rather, we become part of the mystical body of Christ. I was shown this in a big way when a couple days into the course I somehow injured my back. Walking was difficult, and I could not bend over. In order to help me, a fellow classmate who I did not know before last week devoted an entire afternoon, despite the intense amount of reading we had, to driving me to the chiropractor and waiting with me. Then, throughout the week people checked in with me, helped me in various ways, and even walked slower so that I would not be left behind. They did all this not because we had long standing relationships, but rather because I was their sister in Christ. If one member of the body of Christ is hurting, we all are. As we celebrate Jesus' Baptism today, take a moment to offer a prayer of gratitude for our church family. Also, let's ask ourselves, "How can I help or encourage someone at church who I know is suffering?" When our Father sees us living with care for one another you can be sure that he repeats the words he said at Jesus' Baptism and your Baptism as well: "You are my beloved Son [daughter], with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22).
