**FROM FR. JOE**

(NOT SO) ORDINARY TIME

Today is called the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time technically began last Monday. So today begins the second week of Ordinary Time. I like to refer to it as (not so) Ordinary Time, because so many Catholics think this as an uninteresting time. They seem to take the name of the season a bit too literally. Since we are not focusing on Christ's birth, death, or resurrection, so many people think of this time as ordinary (that is, nothing special about it). But "ordinary" does not have to equate to "uninteresting". Ordinary Time is anything but "ordinary" or "uninteresting". Today's Gospel of the Miracle at Cana proves. Christ begins His public ministry today by performing His first miracle of changing water into wine. For 33 to 34 weeks (depending on the year) the Church focuses on Christ's ministry. We will read about miracles performed and hear His parables and other teachings. These stories might not be as interesting as hearing about His birth, death, or resurrection. But it is in these stories that we learn why Christ was born, why He needed to die, why He was resurrected. Christ tells us all about that in His public ministry. Let us journey through Ordinary Time and find out why Christ has come.

## Youth Minister's Letter

Last weekend I had the opportunity to attend a retreat on St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body with some of our high school parishioners. This retreat was about love and relationships. One of the topics that stood out to me involved two of the Greek words for love and how we can use them to know whether we are truly loving another person or if we are lusting after them (i.e. using them). The highest form of love is agape. Agape is self-sacrificial love. This is the type of love that Christ had for us on the cross. This love is all about pouring yourself out for another person. Another type of love is eros. This is passionate love, and it is often associated with romance because eros is the love of desire. In *Deus Caritas Est*, Pope Benedict talks about how both of these types of love are found in God. For, God both empties himself out for us and desires that we return back to him. In a romantic relationship, you can know if you are loving or lusting after the other person by distinguishing whether your primary motive is self-gift or desire (even to the point of taking). In other words, you are truly loving another when agape proceeds eros. Our relationships are always better when eros is at the service of agape. Lust occurs when eros is disconnected from agape (i.e. willing the good of the other), which is when use enters the relationship. This is why John Paul II said that the opposite of love is not hate, it is use. Today, examine your own relationships, both romantic and others. How can you strive to put agapic love first?
