ASK FR. JOE

The question for this week came to me with an article from the bulletin for The Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in Cleveland, Ohio. The rector of the cathedral, Fr. Sean Ralph, wrote the article to address a new practice that was being introduced to the parish: the singing of some of the Mass parts in Latin during this past Lenten season. Specifically, the parish chanted the Holy Holy, the Mystery of Faith, the Our Father, and the Lamb of God in Latin.

Fr. Ralph went on from there to address why the parish was doing this. He gave two main reasons for it. "First of all, it represents the desire of the Church", he explained. Contrary to popular belief among many Catholics and non-Catholics alike, the Second Vatican Council did not get rid of Latin from the Church. Rather, it allowed for the vernacular (that is, the common language of the people) to be used at Mass. However, this same document that allows us to do Mass in English also says, "care must be taken to ensure that the faithful may also be able to say or sing together in Latin those parts ... which pertain to them" (*Sancrosanctum Concilium*, 54). In other words, the Church leaders still want us to know some Latin prayers. Fr. Ralph explained that the goal of doing the Latin Mass parts at the parish was not to switch completely to Latin, but to be in line with the call for Catholics to be able to say or sing the principal Mass parts in Latin.

Fr. Ralph's second reason he gave is that serves the unity of the Church. We say the Church is One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic. We show that very well when we are able to pray with one voice in the same language. Think about all the many languages Catholics speak around the world. Yet if we know a few prayers like the Our Father and the Holy Holy in Latin, we are in a special way united.

This leads me to the question that was asked of me, relating to Fr. Ralph's article. **"Does this mean we can expect more Latin during our Masses?"** It is up to each individual pastor whether he wants to move towards Latin in the Mass, so I can only speak to what I plan to do. I have no plans right now to have us sing or say any of the Mass parts in Latin. However, I may decide to sometime in the future. The same reasons that Fr. Ralph gives for chanting the prayers at his cathedral I have also prayed and reflected on long before I received the original article. The Latin never left the Mass. Our English prayers are based of the Latin. It unites us to our brothers and sisters around the world and to our ancestors who prayed in Latin for centuries. Again, I have no plans for Latin right now. Nothing is going to change overnight. But I invite all of you to join me in prayer, asking God what He wants for His Church and the prayers we offer Him.
