ASK FR. JOE

“You never hear them mention limbo any more. Do they figure it still exists, or is it 'out of the picture' now, and we only have heaven, purgatory and hell to think about?”

For those who are not familiar with the term “limbo”, allow me to explain. Christians believe that Baptism is necessary for salvation. An infant or a young child who dies after baptism will surely go to heaven. However, another question that still comes up today is, what happens to infants who die without being baptized? They have not done anything to merit hell, and yet they have not been baptized which is how we get to heaven. The medieval Church came up with the idea of limbo to help explain what happens to the souls of those little ones. The idea was that souls in limbo did not have the pure joy of those in heaven, but they were not completely separated from God like souls in hell. They were somewhere in between.

Let me be clear here: this teaching on limbo was never an official teaching of the Catholic Church. Yet, despite this not being an official teaching, it has still managed to be taught to Catholics for centuries.

In April of 2007, the Vatican authorized the publication of a document called, “The Hope of Salvation for Infants Who Die Without Being Baptized”. The document does two things. First, it effectively buries the concept of limbo. The document explains that limbo reflected an “unduly restrictive view of salvation”. The whole idea of limbo came up because people thought that God’s ability to offer salvation is restricted. The second thing the document does is explain that there is hope of salvation for infants who die without baptism. Paragraph 1257 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that, “God has bound salvation to the sacrament of Baptism, but he himself is not bound by his sacraments”. We as humans know of no other way than baptism to get to heaven, but God can find other ways. The document mentioned above and other documents encourage us all to put our trust in God’s mercy. It was Jesus himself who said, “Let the children come to me, do not hinder them” (Mk 10:14). Why would God not offer salvation to one of these little ones?

We are in fact all sinners. I am a sinner. Going to confession is a tough one for many, myself included. Why? If you have gone you know how great it feels to walk out of there. But why is it so difficult to walk in? I can't answer this for everyone, but I would love to share my own drawbacks, and maybe I can encourage you to recognize your own. Confession- that word alone made my skin crawl. Why do I get so scared? I have been intimidated by the confessional for most of my life. Is it because I have shame? Yep! Whether my sins have been big or small, venial, or mortal. For myself I tend to not like to admit fault. It is hard to say "I was wrong", but guess what!? God already knows all there is to know about us. Every thought, every action. For the longest time after confession, I would walk out with that wonderful feeling of God's graces, but I would replay my sins in my head after. Why did I do this? Did I forgive myself? Nope. I hung on to things far after I confessed them. Maybe this is why it was hard for me, and still can be at times. Although I was forgiven, I did not feel it because I did not forgive myself. We are not perfect, and sometimes that is hard to recognize. I often hear from Catholics and non-Catholics "I don't need to confess my sins to a Priest." Do we honestly think this? Or is it an excuse? We in fact know that it is Jesus we are confessing to. He is forgiving our sins through our Priest. If confession is something you struggle with like I did, I encourage you to ask yourself, "what is your why?" It may be different from mine, but I promise you that there are ways to overcome the fear and avoidance.
