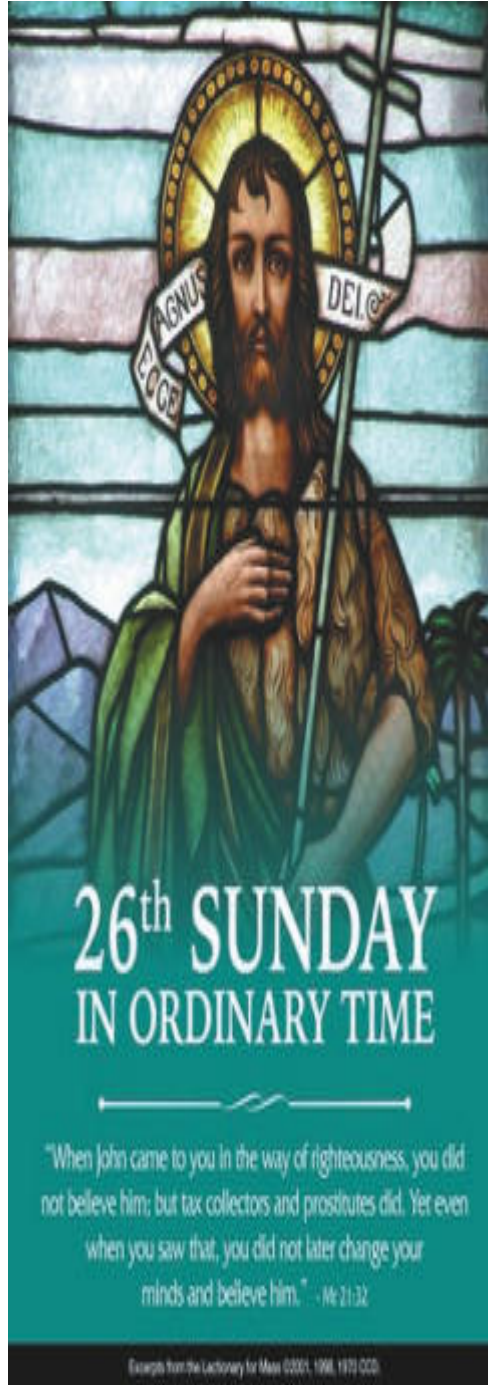

FROM FR. JOE

FEAST OF THE ARCHANGELS – SEPTEMBER 29

This Tuesday, September 29 marks the Feast of the Archangels. The word “angel” means messenger and the prefix “arch-” means chief. So these chief messengers gave very important messages. Three archangels are mentioned in Scriptures: Gabriel who was sent to Daniel (Dan 8:16, 9:21), Zechariah (Lk 1:19) and Mary (Luke 1:26); Raphael who assisted Tobias on a dangerous journey, as recounted in the Book of Tobit; and Michael who led an angelic army against Lucifer and his fellow fallen angels (Dan 10:13-21; Jude 1:9; Rev 12:7).

Catholics have long turned to St. Michael for his protection. He is the patron saint of soldiers and police and is considered the guardian angel of the Pope. For the past several months, I have been leading people in reciting a prayer to St. Michael after daily and Sunday Masses. The prayer asks for his protection against Satan and all evil spirits.

There is a fascinating story behind how this prayer to St. Michael was written. It is hard to prove if it is true, but it still gives us plenty to reflect on. It is said that Pope Leo XIII (about the year 1886) had just finished celebrating Mass when he had a vision. Witnesses say he stopped at the foot of the altar and his face became “pale and fearful”. The story goes that he had overheard a conversation between Jesus and Satan. Not unlike the conversation between God and Satan about Job, Satan was boasting that he could destroy the Church if he was given the time (75 to 100 years) and more power over those who would follow him. Jesus agrees to give him the time and power. Soon after this very frightening vision, Pope Leo XIII wrote the St. Michael prayer and required that it be prayed (along with several other prayers) after every Low Mass around the world. Those prayers are no longer required since the Second Vatican Council, but the Church still encourages us to pray to St. Michael.

Below is a copy of the prayer to St. Michael for your own private prayer.

Saint Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle.
Be our safeguard against
the wickedness and snares of the devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray;
and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host,
by the Power of God, cast into Hell,
Satan and all the evil spirits,
who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.
Amen.
