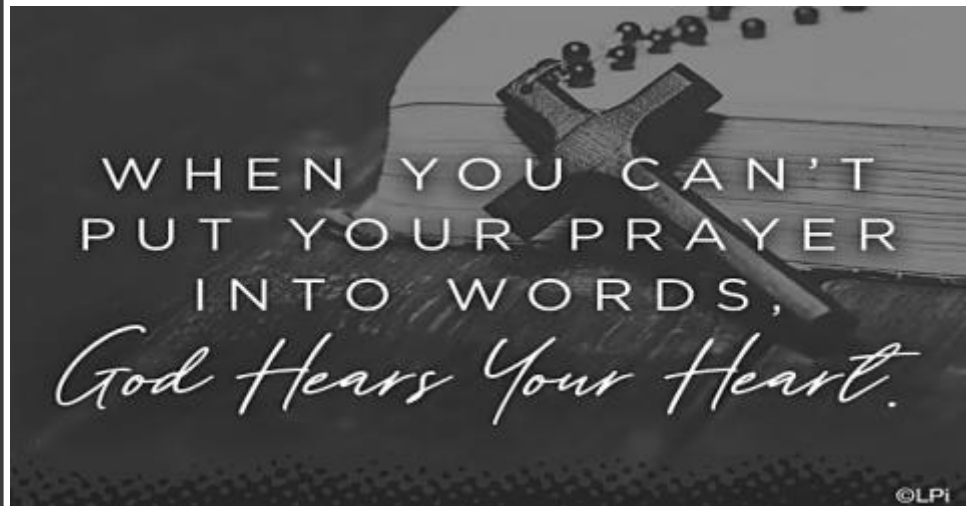
“What is Divine Providence?”

Let me start out by giving the definition from the glossary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

“The dispositions by which God guides his creation toward its perfection yet to be attained; the protection and governance of God over all creation.”

When God created the universe and everything within it, He desired perfection for it all. However, perfection was not complete at the time of creation. A big reason for that is that God wanted us humans to have free will, which allows us to choose both the good and the bad. All creation is called to work towards perfection. The “perfection yet to be attained” means we do not have perfection yet, but we are working towards it. God is guiding us on this journey of sorts towards perfection. When the definition quoted above says “dispositions”, it refers to all the many ways in creation, God is trying to help us all attain perfection. This includes the many different blessings and graces that God gives us as a part of His plan of salvation. In order to work out this plan, however, He also needs the cooperation of His creatures. God cannot force us to participate in all of this. (Remember that thing about free will I mentioned before?) We have to choose to cooperate. Our faith in God makes it possible for us to be a part of this great plan.

We cannot attain perfection all on our own. We need God's help. He is our protector and guide. He is the master of all, and so has governance (that is, He leads and rules) over all of creation. Because of our relationship with God, we are able to participate in and benefit from Divine Providence.

**From Mari Jo Anderson:
Director Religious Education
and Youth Ministry:**

It is in the Catholic Church that you experience the fullness of the seven sacraments, which Christ bestows on His Church to help fill us with grace to draw us closer to God. As Catholics, we have the ultimate privilege of receiving Christ in the most personal way possible—in the Holy Eucharist. Countless Catholics have returned to or entered the Church because of their longing for Jesus in the Eucharist. He longs to feed us with Himself.

Marriage is also one of the sacraments, that a baptized man and a baptized woman administer to each other through their marriage vows and lifelong partnership. Given that a Catholic sacramental marriage reflects the union of Christ with the church as his mystical body, marriage is understood to be an indissoluble union. The marriage union is used to sanctify both the husband and wife by drawing them into a deeper understanding of God's love and is intended to be fruitful, with any children to be raised within the teachings of the church.

The mutual sacrifice and devotion of husband and wife is a true picture of Christ's sanctifying sacrifice and devotion to His Church. 'Matrimony has its significance in the first place from Christ who took the Church as his bride at the price of his own blood. And also, because when he offered his life as the price of her ransom, he stretched out his arms in an embrace of supreme love. And thirdly: as Eve was formed from the side of Adam while he slept, so the Church was formed from the side of the dying and dead Christ, as the two chief sacraments poured from his side - the blood of redemption and the water of absolution' (Albertus Magnus).

I would like to give a special congratulations to my brother Joseph and his bride Miranda as they received the beautiful Sacrament of marriage this past weekend. May God bless them and their new life together as one.
