FROM FR. JOE

GIVING THANKS & OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

October 7 is the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. It is celebrated throughout the Catholic Church on that same date, but it has a special significance for us in the Diocese of Duluth in that it is our patronal feast day. A diocese's or parish's patronal feast day is typically the feast day associated with the saint their cathedral or parish church is named after. So, our Cathedral in Duluth is named after Our Lady of the Rosary; October 7 is our feast day. St. Cecilia's feast is on November 22 so that would be the feast day for Nashwauk. There is no specific feast called "Mary Immaculate", but the title clearly points to Mary's Immaculate Conception, which is celebrated on December 8. This seems like an appropriate feast day for Coleraine.

The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary was originally established as a way to give thanks to Mary for her intercession at a battle on October 7, 1571. The Ottoman Turks were determined to take over territory in the Mediterranean. After several failed attempts at stopping their expansion, a league of Christian states finally made an alliance. Pope St. Pius V knew that a large naval battle would be looming between to two sides. He requested that Catholics around the world to pray the Rosary to ask Our Lady to intercede that the Christians would win the battle. The Christians had a decisive victory on that day. When Pope Pius heard of the victory several days later, he established the Memorial of the Rosary in thanksgiving. Today, we do not recall the battle so much, but we still give thanks to Our Lady for her many intercessions for us.

The Rosary is a wonderful way to pray (or intercede) for others as well as a way to give thanks for the many blessings already received.

In line with that, I want to take a moment to publicly give thanks for the many prayers that were said for me while I recovered from COVID-19. I know many people prayed for me, saying Rosaries and other devotions on my behalf.

Thank you for the bottom of my heart for those prayers. I was very much blessed that the disease never reached a severity for me that required hospitalization or a respirator or any extra medical equipment. I am certain the prayers helped make that possible for me. Thank you to our Blessed Mother and the many saints who prayed for me as well. As I write this, I still get tired rather easily, but I feel much better than I did, so I know I am on the mend. Please keep the prayers coming.

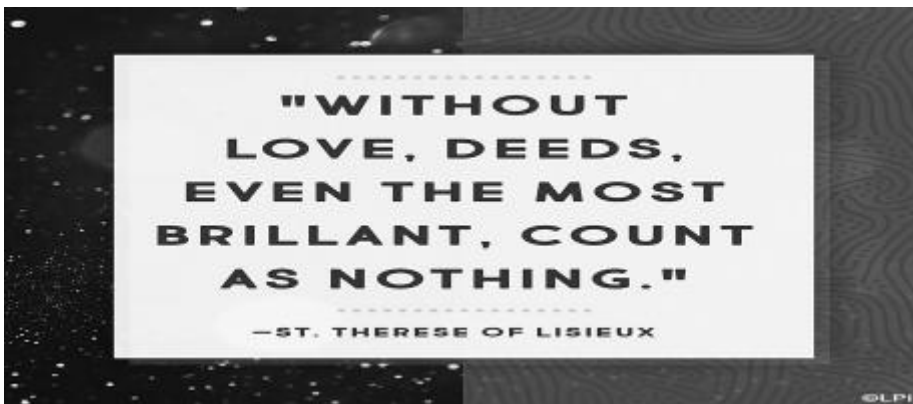

**From Mari Jo Anderson:
Director Religious Education and

Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska of the Blessed Sacrament was born as Helena Kowalska, in Glogowiec, Poland on August 25, 1905. She was the third of 10 children to a poor and religious family. Faustina first felt a calling to the religious life when she was just seven-years-old at the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. After finishing her schooling, Faustina wanted to immediately join a convent. However, her parents refused to let her. So, at 16-years-old, Faustina became a housekeeper. In 1924, Faustina experienced her first vision of Jesus. While at a dance with her sister, Faustina saw a suffering Jesus and then went to a Cathedral. According to Faustina, Jesus instructed her to leave for Warsaw immediately and join a convent. Faustina departed the following morning. When she arrived in Warsaw, she entered Saint James Church in Warsaw, the first church she came across, and attended Mass. While in Warsaw, Faustina approached many different convents, but was turned away every time. She was judged on her appearance and sometimes rejected for poverty. Finally, the mother superior for the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy agreed to take in Faustina on the condition that she could pay for her own religious habit.

On April 30, 1926, at 20-years-old, she finally received her habit and took the religious name of Sister Maria Faustina of the Blessed Sacrament and in 1928, she took her first vows as a nun. In May 1930 she arrived in Plock, Poland. Soon after, she began to show the first signs of her illness and was sent away to rest. On February 22, 1931, Faustina writes in her diary, "In the evening, when I was in my cell, I became aware of the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From the opening of the garment at the breast there came forth two large rays, one red and the other pale. In silence I gazed intently at the Lord; my soul was overwhelmed with fear, but also with great joy. After a while Jesus said to me, 'paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the inscription:

Jesus, I trust in You."
