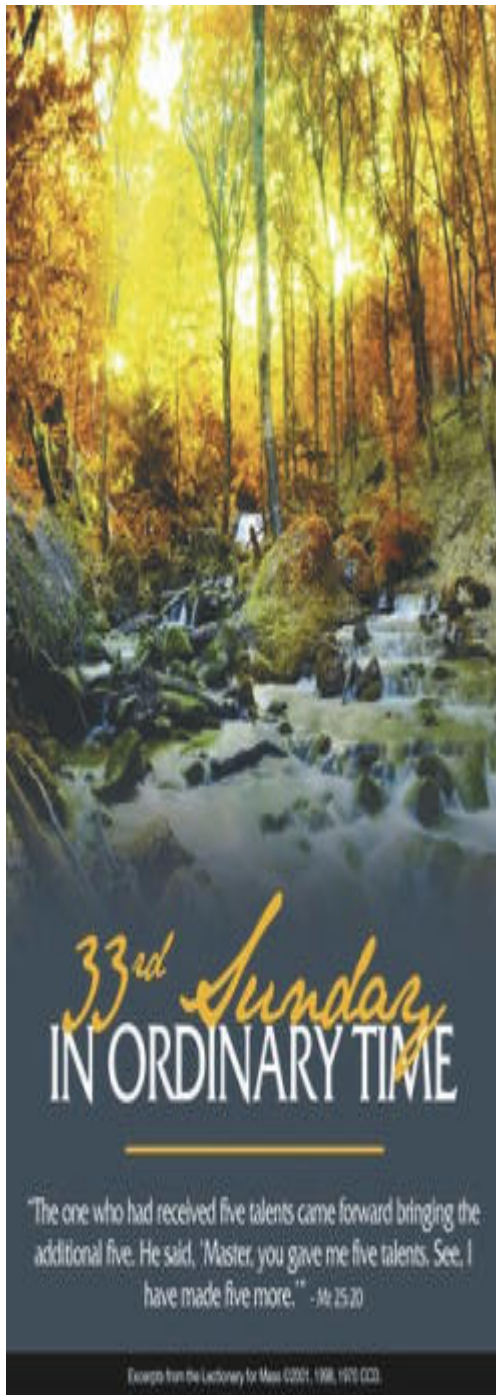

FROM FR. JOE

Caring for those who do not have enough.

Next weekend, November 21 and 22, we will be taking up a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (or CCHD). If you receive giving envelopes from us, you will find a special envelope for that collection. The money collected will be used by the Bishops of the United States to help the poor around the country. The CCHD's mission statement goes as follows:

"The Catholic Campaign for Human Development is the domestic anti-poverty, social justice program of the U.S. Catholic bishops.

"Its mission is to address the root causes of poverty in America through promotion and support of community-controlled, self-help organizations and through transformative education.

"Founded in 1969, CCHD's pastoral strategy is empowerment of the poor through a methodology of participation and education for justice, leading toward solidarity between poor and non-poor as impelled by the Church's biblical tradition, modern Catholic social teaching, and the pervasive presence of poverty in the United States. This ministry for justice is rooted in our baptism and faith commitment.

"The grants, economic development, and education for justice programs of the Campaign, implemented in collaboration with local dioceses, are supported from an annual collection in U.S. Catholic parishes."

You may have heard the old adage, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime". The work for the CCHD takes the second part of that adage to heart. They do not just give out a bunch of money in a poor community and then just leave them to figure it out on their own. Rather, they help get new programs going to help the community and get community members involved in leadership and decision making. They are also big in educating people about how to deal with poverty in a healthy way.

Sadly, the CCHD has gotten some bad publicity and has been accused of giving money to organizations that promote ideas contrary to Catholic Teaching. The CCHD has reviewed and investigated such accusations. When there is a problem, they have worked to address it and rectify the situation. They strive to be as transparent as possible and to make sure that money goes to the right people.

I encourage you to please be as generous as you can for the CCHD collection next week. Simply use the CCHD envelope from your box or write "CCHD" on another envelope. Let us work together to help those in need.
