BLESSING OF THE HOME AT EPIPHANY

There is a Catholic tradition of blessing the home on Epiphany. The following prayers can be done as a family. Blessed chalk for the end of the ceremony can be picked up after Mass.

Leader: Peace be to this house. All: And to all who dwell herein.

Leader: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial.

All: Pray the Magnificat (Lk 1:46-55):

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior. For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness; behold, from now on will all ages call me blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is from age to age to those who fear him. He has shown might with his arm, dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart. He has thrown down the rulers from their thrones but lifted up the lowly. The hungry he has filled with good things; the rich he has sent away empty. He has helped Israel his servant, remembering his mercy, according to his promise to our fathers, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.

All: Our Father. . .

Leader: Be enlightened, be enlightened, O Jerusalem, for your light is come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon you—Jesus Christ born of the Virgin Mary.

All: And the Gentiles shall walk in your light and kings in the splendor of your rising, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

Leader: Let us pray. Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star.

Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **All:** Amen.

After the prayers the characters 20 + C + M + B + 22 are inscribed upon the doors (the outside doors and any inside doors you wish to do as well) with the blessed chalk. C, M, B stand for the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. They can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house".


