

FROM FR. JOE

Baptism of the lord and (not so) ordinary time

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is considered the last day in the Christmas Season. Next we celebrate Ordinary Time, which technically begins tomorrow (Monday). It lasts through Tuesday, March 1, the day before Ash Wednesday, and resumes on Monday, June 6, the day after Pentecost, until Saturday, November 26. As you can see, Ordinary Time lasts well over half the year.

I like to refer to this season as (not so) Ordinary Time to remind people that this is an important time of the year. So many Catholics think this as an uninteresting time. They seem to take the name of the season a bit too literally. Since we are not focusing on Christ's birth, death, or resurrection, so many people think of this time as ordinary (that is, nothing special about it). But "ordinary" does not have to equate to "uninteresting". Ordinary Time is anything but "ordinary" or "uninteresting". This is the season in which we get to hear about all the miracles Christ performed during His public ministry.

It is quite appropriate that Ordinary Time follows our celebration of Christ's Baptism. The Gospels tell how after His cousin John the Baptist baptized Him He is led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness. There He spends 40 days in fasting and prayer and is tempted by Satan. Immediately afterwards He begins His public ministry. It was His baptism that got the ball rolling for Jesus to be ready for ministry.

For 33 to 34 weeks (depending on the year) the Church focuses on Christ's ministry. We will read about miracles performed and hear His parables and other teachings. These stories might not be as interesting as hearing about His birth, death, or resurrection. But it is in these stories that we learn why Christ was born, why He needed to die, why He was resurrected. Christ tells us all about that in His public ministry. Let us journey through Ordinary Time and find out why Christ has come


