

FROM FR. JOE

HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

This time of the Liturgical year I often find to be a bit and confusing for people. Last Sunday saw the end of Easter with Pentecost. So we returned to the season of Ordinary Time last Monday. However, you will notice that we are not using green vestments or altar decorations. Nor do we refer to this as the "Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time" or any other number. This Sunday and the next have special Feast Days we celebrate. We also have a couple extra special Feast Days at the end of next week. These special days are based off of when the Easter season ends. So, just as we never celebrate Easter on the same day each year, so also these feasts move around as well. It can be a bit confusing trying to figure out where we are in the Liturgical Year, but in the hopes of making it a little clearer, here is a brief explanation of the upcoming celebrations.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY – JUNE 12

This solemnity (which means that it is a solemn or really big feast day) always comes a week after Pentecost Sunday. The celebration focuses on the fact that we believe in a Triune God. This means we believe in only one God, who is three distinct persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe they are distinct, but never completely separate from each other. For example, the Father is often associated with creation, the Son with redemption, and the Holy Spirit with sanctification. When these events took place, however, all three persons were there and were a part of it. The Trinity is often referred to as a mystery: we can learn a lot about it throughout our lifetime, but we will probably never understand all of it.

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST – JUNE 19

Often referred to by its Latin name, Corpus Christi (Body of Christ), this day was originally on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. In the US it was eventually moved to the following Sunday, probably to encourage more people to come to Mass and participate. This Solemnity was started by Pope Urban IV in 1264 to encourage greater devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Many parishes, towns, and cities across the world celebrate this day with Eucharistic processions.

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS – JUNE 24

This solemnity focuses on Jesus' mercy. It takes place on the second Friday after Trinity Sunday. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was a French nun who was instrumental in helping to spread devotion to the Sacred Heart.

THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY – JUNE 25

This day is only ranked as a memorial (a smaller feast day) but it is still important. It comes the day after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart focuses on how Mary holds all things in her heart and prays for us.

Different families have different ways of relaxing.

The important thing is to have your finger on what helps your family unwind. Is it having a daily schedule to curb the chaos? Maybe a trip to the pool or park to burn off steam? Whatever it is – make a plan and carve out time for those things that will help you all truly take time to refresh yourselves as we head into summer break. School year schedules can be rushed and hectic. Summer is a good time to slow it down a little. If you have more time on your hands than usual, consider adding in some family prayer – a family rosary, liturgy of the hours, or some Bible reading.

If you are traveling, check and see if there are any pilgrimage sites at your destination or along the way. If you aren't traveling, see if there are any near your home! Together with a culture of work, there must be a culture of leisure as gratification. To put it another way: people who work must take the time to relax, to be with their families, to enjoy themselves, read, listen to music, play a sport. But this is being destroyed, in large part, by the elimination of the Sabbath rest day. More and more people work on Sundays as a consequence of the competitiveness imposed by a consumer society.
