# FROM FR. JOE

# Pange Lingua

Today is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi which commemorates the institution of the Most Holy Eucharist, The Body and Blood of our Lord. This feast day seems to start out in the Early Church as a part of Holy Thursday, when we commemorate the Last Supper. Eventually it got its own feast day, separated from Holy Week. On September 8, 1264, Pope Urban IV wrote a decree (called a "Bull") that encouraged devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and declared the Thursday after Trinity Sunday to be a Solemnity focused on the Eucharist. The US Bishops later decided to move the feast to the following Sunday, probably to encourage more people to come to the Mass that day.

Pope Urban IV had St. Thomas Aquinas write a set of prayers for the celebration of Corpus Christi. This includes the text of a hymn called *Pange Lingua*, which is the hymn that is traditionally sung on Holy Thursday as the Eucharist is processed around the Church and taken to a separate altar (called the Altar of Repose). The last two verses of this hymn are referred to as the *Tantum Ergo*, which is traditionally sung at Eucharistic Exposition during Benediction.

Here is the *Pange Lingua* in English. I invite you to take some time to pray these words.

Sing, my tongue, the Savior's glory, of His flesh the mystery sing; of the Blood, all price exceeding, shed by our immortal King, destined, for the world's redemption, from a noble womb to spring.

Of a pure and spotless Virgin born for us on earth below, He, as Man, with man conversing, stayed, the seeds of truth to sow; then He closed in solemn order wondrously His life of woe.

On the night of that Last Supper, seated with His chosen band, He the Pascal victim eating, first fulfills the Law's command; then as Food to His Apostles gives Himself with His own hand.

Word-made-Flesh, the bread of nature by His word to Flesh He turns; wine into His Blood He changes; what though sense no change discerns? Only be the heart in earnest, faith her lesson quickly learns.

Down in adoration falling, Lo! the sacred Host we hail; Lo! o'er ancient forms departing, newer rites of grace prevail; faith for all defects supplying, where the feeble senses fail.

To the everlasting Father, and the Son who reigns on high, with the Holy Ghost proceeding forth from each eternally, be salvation, honor, blessing, might and endless majesty. Amen.

### From Mari Jo Anderson: Director of Religious Education

### The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and

**Blood of Christ**, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Encountering Christ in the Eucharist is a gift. A gift to all of us. The Church's teaching about the Eucharist is deeply rooted in sacred Scripture. Here are just five examples:

1. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me (John 6:54-57).


**2.** For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes (1 Corinthians 11:26).

**3.** They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles (Acts 2:42-43).

**4.** Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf (1 Corinthians 10:17).

**5.** I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die (John 6:48-50).

Receiving Christ in the Eucharist is nothing to be taken lightly, Jesus out of Love and mercy gives Himself to us over and over again. The very first Mass was the Last Supper. It is absolutely amazing that over 2,000 years later we are still able to receive Him the way He told us to. May we all remember and recognize that Jesus is the Eucharist. (Luke 22:19-20) Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you.



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
