THE VATICAN UNVEILED

I wanted to use this space in the bulletin this week to invite all of you to a very special opportunity coming to Duluth in August. You may have heard that Fr. Richard Kunst is the owner and curator of the world's largest collection of Papal artifacts outside of Rome. As you can well imagine, he has been amassing this large collection over a number of years.

This amazing collection will be on display for the second time in Duluth, **August 19-21**. I would like to personally encourage all of you to come to **Vatican Unveiled**: **An Exploration of Legacies**.

This exhibit will allow you to get up close and personal not only to the papacy, but ultimately with history that has changed our world. Vatican, papal, saints, and other religious artifacts will be on display for three days at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center. You will even have a chance to hear the stories of how Fr. Kunst collected some of his rarest items.

All proceeds from this event will go to Stella Maris Academy (the Catholic school in Duluth) and Star of the North Maternity Home (an organization that helps support homeless pregnant women with buildings in Duluth and Hibbing). So, not only will this be an excellent opportunity to learn more about our Catholic faith and the history of the world, but we have a chance to help support Catholic education and a charitable organization that is doing good right in our backyard.

I myself have personally seen a good number of the pieces in this collection. They are really amazing to behold. It is hard to believe you are actually standing in front of a document that was signed by a pope or an article of clothing that was actually worn by a saint.

There are also chances to volunteer and to sponsor the event. More information including ticket prices and the opportunity to purchase tickets early can be found at vaticanunveiled.com.

Once again I invite and encourage all of you to go. Talk to family and friends and make a day trip to Duluth for it. You will not regret it

I hope you all enjoy the 4th of July! As many of you know, my husband and I are about to welcome our newest family member very soon. We are very excited for our daughter's arrival. Please keep our family in your prayers, I can't wait to see God's plan for her.

The big assumption of modern times, of course, is that babies hold women back. Which in a sense, they kind of do! They interrupt careers, change plans, and also poop and cry a lot. The family is plugging along just fine, everyone is out of diapers and able to make his or her own sandwich, and then BOOM. Enter a fussy baby. Enter starting all over again at age thirty-one. Enter lots (and lots) of conversations with other moms at sporting events and school functions, who are curious about why you decided to have another baby when your oldest is thirteen. Enter some ensuing serious time spent considering how the family routine seemed so simple before, but now it's all thrown off because this small-but-mighty little creature is now running the show. Yet God's design for marriage necessitates an openness to new life. So how are we Catholics to think about the whole matter? In Saint Pope John Paul Il's **Letter to Families**, he writes: The process from conception and

growth in the mother's womb to birth makes it possible to create a space within which the new creature can be revealed as a "gift": indeed this is what it is from the very beginning. Could this frail and helpless being, totally dependent upon its parents and completely entrusted to them, be seen in any other way? The newborn child gives itself to its parents by the very fact of its coming into existence. Its existence is already a gift, the first gift of the Creator to the creature.In the newborn child is realized the common good of the family. Just as the common good of spouses is fulfilled in conjugal love, ever ready to give and receive new life, so too the common good of the family is fulfilled through that same spousal love, as embodied in the newborn child...The child becomes a gift to its brothers, sisters, parents and entire family. Its life becomes a gift for the very people who were givers of life and who cannot help but feel its presence, its sharing in their life and its contribution to their common good and to that of the community of the family.
