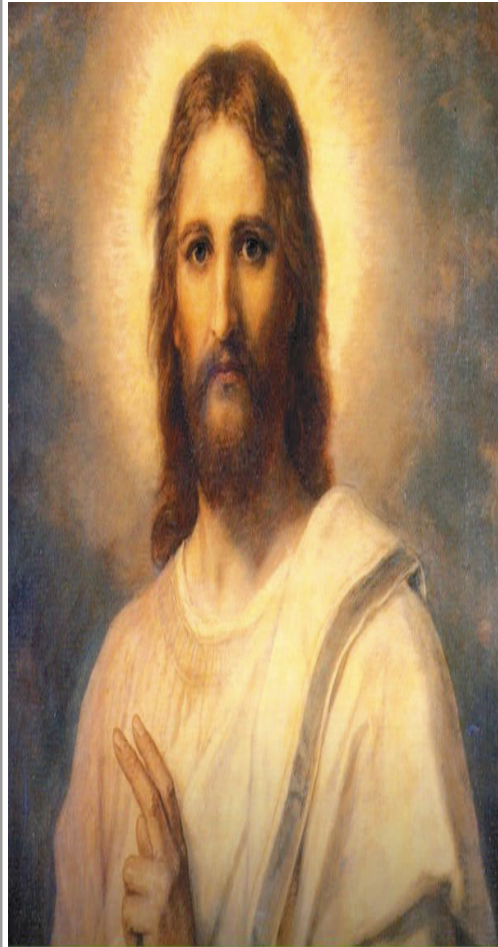

FROM FR. JOE

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

I want to take a moment to talk to you about a very exciting movement that is happening in our country. The United States Bishops are working together to bring about a National Eucharistic Revival. Their goal is to help Catholics all over the nation to have a deep and profound relationship with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Their website, www.eucharisticrevival.org, describes it as follows:

“Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal.

“In the midst of these roaring waves, Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world.

“How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith—the Holy Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the U.S. to this divine invitation.

The revival will take place over a three year period. Year one (June 2022 – June 2023) will focus on the diocesan level. All the dioceses in the United States will be encouraged to have events and programs that will foster a greater understanding and devotion to the Eucharist. Year two (June 2023 – June 2024) will be on the parish level. We will be doing things in our own parishes to learn more and grow in our love for God and the Holy Eucharist. Year three (July 2024 – July 2025) will be on the national level. The year will start off with a National Eucharist Congress in Indianapolis where our nation will be re-consecrated to our Lord.

Continued from last week....

Don Dolindo received from Jesus the words of Surrender Novena. It is a prayer that is especially timely now, when world events feel out of control, and we are trying to grow in trust and abandonment to God's providence.

"You see evil growing instead of weakening?" Jesus says in this prayer. "Do not worry. Close your eyes and say to me with faith: 'Thy will be done, You take care of it.' I say to you that I will take care of it, and that I will intervene as does a doctor and I will accomplish miracles when they are needed." It's also timely when our own personal suffering is threatening to overwhelm us and steal our peace.

"Repose in me, believing in my goodness, and I promise you by my love that if you say, 'You take care of it,' I will take care of it," Jesus' words in the prayer assure us.

As I write this, I have been holding back tears, because I just found out that, at least for the remainder of Lent, we will not be able to attend Mass in our diocese because of the pandemic. The idea of not being able to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, especially during a crisis, is crushing.

Yet this great suffering, this separation, is a chance to be united with Jesus in the Garden and on Calvary. We can join with Him, in a small way, in the isolation, loneliness, distance from God, and abandonment He felt. In being with Him there, we can console His Sacred Heart. (Padre Pio wrote a beautiful reflection on the Agony in the Garden that you can find here that explains in more depth how we can accompany Jesus in His suffering.)

Jesus abandoned Himself completely to His Father's will. As this Lent unfolds before us in ways we never imagined, Don Dolindo's Surrender Novena gives us a way to follow Jesus in His total abandonment, and to let Him "take care of everything."

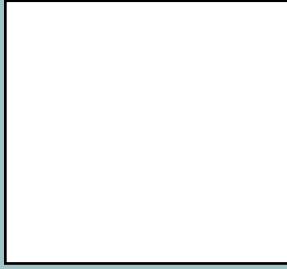

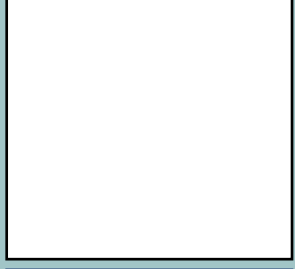
