# ASK FR. JOE

# "What would be some spiritual ways we could intercede for fallen away Catholics?"

I once heard a speaker talk about praying for people. He mentioned that people often pray that God would make their loved ones stop doing their destructive lifestyle. It might be drugs, alcohol, living with a boyfriend/girlfriend outside of marriage, or even not going to Church. We ask God to make them stop sinning or to make them go to Church again, and then we are shocked and angry when we find that God is not doing exactly what we asked Him to do. We assume that God would want people to come back from sin right away with no detours.

The speaker pointed out that we need to remember that God's ways are not our ways. Sometimes God allows sin to take place so that an even great good will happen. For instance, a person may stop going to Mass and enter into a relationship with children outside of marriage and then later, a civil marriage. This continues for many years, but when the person finally comes back to the Catholic faith (aoing to Mass weekly and participating in the Sacraments), they bring their spouse and their children to the faith as well. Another family member may have been praying fervently for this individual since they stopped coming to Mass that God would make this person come to Mass again and turn away from sin. But if God had "made" the person do that right away, he or she may never have met their future spouse. The spouse is then never brought to the faith and the children never exist! I am not trying to lead us down a path of "what if's". My point is that God may have a reason for why conversions do not happen as fast as we would like them.

The speaker I was listening to suggested that when we pray for individuals, we should pray that they come closer to God. Do not pray for anything specific to happen; it might not be a part of God's will. But when we pray for family and friends to come closer to God, we will start to see some wonderful results. As they grow closer to God, they seek to do His will all the more.

"Not my will, but your will be done!

#### From Mari Jo Anderson: Director of Religious Education Continued from last week.... The novena itself follows:

**DAY 1**: Why do you confuse yourselves by worrying? Leave the care of your affairs to me and everything will be peaceful. I say to you in truth that every act of true, blind, complete surrender to me produces the effect that you desire and resolves all difficult situations.

### O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 2: Surrender to me does not mean to fret, to be upset, or to lose hope, nor does it mean offering to me a worried prayer asking me to follow you and change your worry into prayer. It is against this surrender, deeply against it, to worry, to be nervous and to desire to think about the consequences of anything. It is like the confusion that children feel when they ask their mother to see to their needs, and then try to take care of those needs for themselves so that their childlike efforts get in their mother's way. Surrender means to placidly close the eyes of the soul, to turn away from thoughts of tribulation and to put yourself in my care, so that only I act. Saying "You take care of it."

### O Jesus, I surrender ..... (Say 10 times)

DAY 3: How many things I do when the soul, in so much spiritual and material need, turns to me, looks at me and says to me; "You take care of it", then closes its eyes and rests. In pain you pray for me to act, but that I act in the way you want. You do not turn to me, instead, you want me to adapt to your ideas. You are not sick people who ask the doctor to cure you, but rather sick people who tell the doctor how to. So do not act this way, but pray as I taught you in the Our Father: Hallowed be thy Name, that is, be glorified in my need. Thy kingdom come", that is, let all that is in us and in the world be in accord with your kingdom. Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven, that is, in our need, decide as you see fit for our temporal and eternal life. If you say to me truly: Thy will be done. Which is the same as saying: You take care of it. I will intervene with all my omnipotence, and I will resolve the most difficult situations.
