FROM FR. JOE

WHY GO TO DAILY MASS?

I believe that most of you who are reading this article already know the importance of going to Sunday Mass. You know the Third Commandment, "Thou shalt keep holy the Sabbath Day", includes going to Mass on Sunday every Sunday and the many other advantages to going to Sunday Mass. But this article is going to focus on the importance of going to daily Mass.

I am willing to bet that a majority of Catholics are unaware that their parish even has daily Mass available. Of those who do know, the majority of them probably would be unable to say what the daily Mass schedule at their parish is. Now, before you flip to the front of the bulletin to look at the schedule, here it is again for your convenience: **St. Cecilia at 6 PM Tuesdays and 8:30 AM Wednesdays and Mary Immaculate at 8:30 AM on Thursdays and Fridays.**

The reason I am bringing all this up is because we have daily Masses available, but the number of participants at those Masses is dreadful. Many times I only have 2 or 3 people on Tuesday evening and only about 5-7 on Wednesday and Thursday. Friday will often get to 10 people or more, but that is still rather small. Obviously no one is required to go to daily Mass. Many people have to be at work or school in the morning and cannot make it to a morning Mass. That being said, I want to encourage more people to come.

A question that you may be asking yourself is: why should I go to daily Mass when it is not even required? Here are a few reasons to consider:

- The grace of the Sacrament or the Most Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the food we receive to help us during the week. What if we could receive a "grace booster" if you will? Think of it as a little extra spiritual help during the week. Daily Mass is a way to do that.
- Extra prayer time = extra time to talk with our Father. Mass is worship which is a form of prayer. Prayer is conversation with God. When we go to daily Mass we get to spend an extra half hour in prayer and worship with God. This is extra time to sit and talk in our Father's own house.
 Matthew 18:20 – "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them". Jesus Christ is with us in Mass not only in the Eucharist but also in the fact that we are gathered together in His name. Those other people are also a community that we can rely on in difficult times.

Why would we not want these things?

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 8: Close your eyes and let yourself be carried away on the flowing current of my grace; close your eyes and do not think of the present, turning your thoughts away from the future just as you would from temptation. Repose in me, believing in my goodness, and I promise you by my love that if you say "You take care of it" I will take care of it all; I will console you, liberate you and guide you.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 9: Pray always in readiness to surrender, and you will receive from it great peace and great rewards, even when I confer on you the grace of immolation, of repentance and of love. Then what does suffering matter? It seems impossible to you? Close your eyes and say with all your soul, "Jesus, you take care of it." Do not be afraid, I will take care of things and you will bless my name by humbling yourself. A thousand prayers cannot equal one single act of surrender, remember this well. There is no novena more effective than this:

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 4: You see evil growing instead of weakening? Do not worry, Close your eyes and say to me with faith: "Thy will be done, You take care of it". I say to you that I will take care of it, and that I will intervene as does a doctor and I will accomplish miracles when they are needed. Do you see that the sick person is getting worse? Do not be upset, but close your eyes and say You take care of it. I say to you that I will take care of it, and that there is no medicine more powerful than my loving intervention. By my love, I promise this to you.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 5: And when I must lead you on a path different from the one you see, I will prepare you; I will carry you in my arms; I will let you find yourself, like children who have fallen asleep in their mother's arms, on the other bank of the river. What troubles you and hurts you immensely are your reason, your thoughts and worry, and your desire at all costs to deal with what afflicts you.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 6: You are sleepless; you want to judge everything, direct everything and see to everything and you surrender to human strength, or worse- to men themselves, trusting in their intervention,- this is what hinders my words and my views. Oh how much I wish from you this surrender, to help you and how I suffer when I see you so agitated! Satan tries to do exactly this: to agitate you and to remove you from my protection and to throw you into the jaws of human initiative. So, trust only in me, rest in me, surrender to me in everything.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything! (Say 10 times)

DAY 7: I perform miracles in proportion to your full surrender to me and to your not thinking of yourselves. I sow treasure troves of graces when you are in the deepest poverty. No person of reason, no thinker, has ever performed miracles, not even among the saints. He does divine works whosoever surrenders to God. So don't think about it any more, because your mind is acute and for you it is very hard to see evil and to trust in me and to not think of yourself. Do this for all your needs, do this all of you and you will see great continual silent miracles. I will

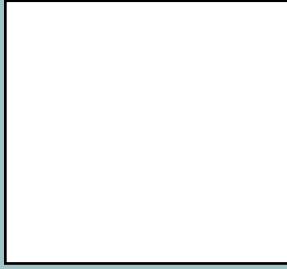

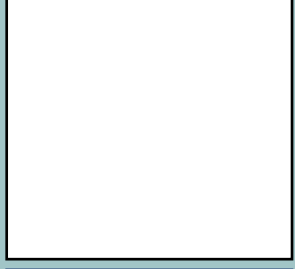
