

## FROM OUR PASTOR

### Fathers and farewells

Dear friends in Christ,

Moving and saying goodbye can be difficult. This being my final column with you, I wish to leave you with a few reflections on fathers and farewells—it is Father's Day! These ideas come from two articles found at <u>life-craft.org</u>. I hope you find this mixture of ideas helpful as we honor fathers and experience the transition of pastors.

In the Catholic Church we are accustomed to calling our pastor *father*. For many non-Catholics this is a point of contention. And yes, I have experienced this tension in my fifteen years of priesthood. Is it absolutely essential for me to be called father? No. My vocation to the priesthood is made permanent through the sacrament of Holy Orders. That permanency remains, even when a priest fails in his duties.

What are the responsibilities of a Catholic priest? The word priest is derived from a Latin word meaning "bridge-builder." The purpose of a bridge is obvious: to connect, to cross-over, or to make a pathway from one side to another. A bridge is usually placed over a stretch of water, another roadway, or other rough, impassable terrain.

The author of the Life-Craft article says, "If a person is to build a bridge, he must have a foothold on both sides of the divide. Otherwise, how could he effect a connection? Here emerges the fuller drama of this whole situation. A priest is to be a bridge builder, but given the nature of the chasm to be bridged, there must first be an initiation from the upper side. If this man is to be a real connector, he must be imbued with a power not his as a man. But nonetheless his."

We need to pray for our priests to be holy. The author continues, "His work likewise calls the priest to exemplify the human. His mysterious and potent fatherhood, a multifaceted work and profound crafting of the good life, should begin in being a good man. He will then be best positioned to weave a human fabric with divine threads." (*When a man becomes a priest*, 6/9/2021)

Therefore, attempting to be a good man, a good priest, and a good spiritual father, I turn to the topic of saying farewell. Shakespeare says, "Parting is such sweet sorrow." Saying goodbye provides the opportunity for three important things: express gratitude, ask forgiveness, and offer encouragement. (Life-craft.org/blog, *Learning to say goodbye*, 5/12/2021) First, I thank you for the unique ways your presence has touched my life. Everyone's unique personality has something to offer in God's Kingdom!

If I failed to be a bridge... and when I lacked the light and image of Christ in my daily tasks, I ask forgiveness. The humanity of the priesthood lives alongside the divine graces of our Savior. I pray for the strength to cooperate with those graces evermore completely.

Fathers will win the trust of their children and family when they become a source of encouragement. Learning to ride a bike, shooting clay pigeons, or practicing to parallel park are only some of the opportunities for positive feedback. Seeing the small, God-given talents in your spouse and children takes patience and careful attention. Investing in your family and reinforcing the blessing of their worth as how God created them is crucial. As your outgoing pastor, I leave you with the encouragement to grow closer to Jesus every day. I especially see the opportunity for this when the congregation prays quietly at the end of Mass. There is no better time to allow Christ to cultivate your spiritual growth than at the moment you receive Him in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is the best source of encouragement... especially for fathers and farewells.


