#### A MESSAGE FROM FR PHIL

A Reflection, not a Sermon... "Little Christmas," camels, hope as a light in the darkness, and wisdom to follow God's ways... these are the thoughts that come to me when I think of Epiphany.

This is the Eastern Church's "Big Christmas" as it focuses on these wise seekers from the East. The catchy phrase, often seen on church billboards, "Wise men still

seek him,"alerts us to a longing for something more in each of us... Something that makes sense of a world shrouded in the darkness of greedy, power-hungry leaders and the wars that they stir up. There must be something, <u>some one</u>, who can make sense of it all.

The camels lead the Magi... strange, desert-adapted creatures with a plodding, determined gait. In the live nativity program in Springfield, they always steal the show. So out of place in the frozen northland, they seem docile yet stubbornly focused on playing their part. They carry the seekers and the gifts they bring. They yield to the Mystery much bigger than they can comprehend.

Having experienced the first big blizzard of the year we have known the darkness, the cold and the raw fear of powers beyond our control. We too seek a revelation, an inspiration and a direction that will give us hope. And it comes as a Star... a light for <u>all</u> peoples of every race and tongue. It brings warmth and love and understanding. It reveals the saving smiles on the faces of <u>all</u> of God's children. It is God's own smile on the Universe.

The wisdom to follow God's ways is embodied in the decision of the Magi to trust their dream and courageously disobey the greedy and devious King Herod. The risk of going against him was huge. He was known for his ruthless violence against anyone who stood in his way. Yet they bowed to the power and the loving way of the Tiny King that Herod could not accept and certainly not welcome or adore.

So this is Epiphany... a revelation, a sign of hope and an invitation to steadfastly follow the way that was illuminated by the heavenly gaze on a needy world.

## **HOME BLESSING**

It is an ancient tradition to bless our homes at Epiphany with Holy Water and Blessed Chalk. Epiphany means not only the 3 Wise Men, but also the Baptism of the Lord – they used to be celebrated on the same day. Usually the father would write the blessing using the blessed chalk over each and every door going outside:

AD 20+C+M+B+23 which stands for "Anno Domini 2023--Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar" and means "the three Holy Kings, Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar, in the year of Our Lord, 2023" are protecting this house against all evil spirits.

The letters C.M.B. also stand for **C**hristus **M**ansionem **B**enedicat = **May Christ bless this house**. This tradition of blessing the doorways (with blessed chalk) symbolizes the family's commitment to welcome Christ into their homes on a daily basis throughout the year.

Chalk, bottles of Holy Water and the Home Blessing prayer for the Feast of the Epiphany sheets are available for you in the entry way.
