From Fr. Steffl:

Merry Christmas to all! Thanks to the CCW who donated towards the book that we are offering at Christmas this year in our parishes. Thanks also to all who helped to decorate for Christmas in our parishes, once again!

Reminder of the Holy Day at the end of this week, January 1. Since it falls on a Saturday, there are vigil Masses scheduled on Friday, Dec. 31, as well as the morning of Saturday, January 1. Then we have the usual weekend Masses for Saturday evening and Sunday Morning for the weekend Masses. Once again a reminder that there are <u>no "2-for-1 deals"</u> to go to Mass one time on Saturday to count for both the Holy Day and the Sunday Mass obligation.

As we look forward to the end of the calendar year, please get any remaining donations to the parish offices as soon as possible if you want them to go on your statement for tax purposes for the year 2021 (please note that the last day of the year is Friday, Dec. 31, this is a paid day off for office staff so no one will be in the offices on that day). I am grateful for your support in all our parishes!

A few big projects at St. Mary's that I need to raise money to get done this next year, in addition to the church floor, are the elevator project in the St. Mary's Grade School for \$150,000 and extensive tuck-pointing of the church, which will cost \$125,500. I have mentioned both of these projects already, and am hoping to get them done this next summer. I realize that these are not small amounts of money, but am hoping that these needs might inspire some extra generosity, as they are urgent. In the bulletin's stewardship section, there is a separate line for each of these projects. (I always like to note that my job is to ask for money for Jesus, and He is giving me a lot of opportunities these days! And if you say "no," it is to the Lord, not me... I am only the messenger.)

Looking forward to the New Year, I would like to encourage everyone to make a "Spiritual New Years' Resolution" for 2022. Some things that I would suggest, if you are not already doing them. Any or all of these will make a big difference in your life:

- A scheduled hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament each week (*it is my hope and goal that EVERYONE in our parishes would have a weekly Holy Hour commitment with the Lord*. Signing up for a time, even if you share that hour with someone else already scheduled is a great way to be accountable to the Lord!)
- Daily Rosary (as a family, if possible)
- A weekday Mass (or more if you can...)
- Monthly visit to the confessional

There are some very beautiful Feast Days in the Christmas Season, including this Sunday, the Epiphany, the arrival of the Three Wise Men!

Please call the parish office if you are in need of a priest. I think especially of the homebound who would benefit from being on our First Friday visit list, or those who need the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. As priests, we don't know unless you call us or tell us.

The Nativity Scene donated by John Rosenhammer that we auctioned off during Advent was purchased by the "Ken and Denise Kalkhoff Family Charitable Fund," and the money is going to the fund to replace the elevator at St. Mary's Grade School. The buyer donated the Nativity Scene to the Chancery Offices of the Diocese of New Ulm, and they were very happy to receive it!


