From Fr. Steffl:

This Sunday, January 9, is the start of a **new adult education study titled: St. Peter – Cornerstone of Catholicism.** It is a 10-part series, and we will be meeting at 6 pm each Sunday in the St. Mary's social room. Each session will last an hour, and I would like to encourage people, consider the opportunity to learn more about the Catholic Faith. (Even if you cannot make all the sessions, please consider coming!)

At St. Mary's, we are going to be <u>raising the requested donation for the week-long votive</u> <u>candles from \$3 to \$5</u> (effective immediately) so that we are not losing money on them. It has been a long time since the cost of this has been adjusted, so thank you for your understanding.

We as priests will be helping to cover the Fairfax area parishes while Fr. Bruno returns to India for the month of January. Fr. Sam Perez will be going home to see his family in Guatemala from January 10-29. (For both of these priests, it has been a long time since they have been able to return to their homes and see their families because of the pandemic.) If there is anything that comes up while Fr. Sam is gone, please call the St. Mary's office in Sleepy Eye.

January 22, (this year on a Saturday) is the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, and the legalization of abortion in the United States, **St. Mary's will once again be sponsoring a bus to the rally and prayer service that takes place in St. Paul.** Please <u>call the St. Mary's office to hold a place on the bus</u>. This is open to ANYONE who would like to go from any parish. More specific details will be in next week's bulletin about departure times and locations, etc. Each year for the past handful of years, Bishop LeVoir had offered a partial indulgence to anyone from the Diocese of New Ulm who attends the rally and prayer service, and Msgr. Grams, the diocesan administrator is once again offering that indulgence for this year. Our area parishes have always been especially good about attending this annual event and I hope that we will be able to fill a bus once again this year as we continue to pray for an end to abortion, the greatest evil of our time, and for a renewed respect for life in our country and in the minds of our political leaders.




