From Fr. Steffl:

Pastor Saturday, January 22 (this year on a Saturday), is the annual Pro-life Rally and Prayer Service at the Cathedral in St. Paul. I found out that Cathedral in New Ulm is sponsoring a bus that I hope we can help to fill. The coach bus loads at 7:40 A.M. at the Cathedral parking lot in New Ulm, stopping first at the Cathedral of St. Paul for the Prayer for Life, followed by a short walk to the MCCL Rally at the MN State Capitol at noon. Dress for the weather, and keep in mind that the bus is available as needed to warm up during the march. Please plan to bring your lunch. Return time will be 3:00 P.M. Families are welcome and children must be accompanied by an adult. Call the Cathedral office at 507-354-4158 to reserve a seat. Questions can be directed to trip coordinator Kate Sloot at sloot@newulmtel.net.

On Sunday, January 23, the 7-8 pm holy hour at St. Mary's will be a Holy Hour for Life including a Rosary and sung Divine Mercy Chaplet. I am hoping for a huge crowd for this Holy Hour, as the issue of life is so central to who we are as followers of the Lord who is the Author of Life!

Also next weekend, January 22/23, our parishes will be taking up a second collection to help assist with pro-life activities in our area and greater Minnesota. This is our chance to make a personal contribution to raising awareness of this important issue.

I have had some inquiries about the St. Mary's "floor and windows" project. Everything is on schedule for this to be completed this upcoming summer. We are planning on moving the pews out of the church beginning June 1. I hope that we can get a lot of volunteer help on those first days of June to move them to the school's Field House where they will be stored until they can be re-installed when the new terrazzo floor is completed. During the time that the floor is being installed over the summer, Masses will be in the St. Mary's Church social room, having considered the best location with accessibility, parking, bathrooms, etc. (Although it has not been confirmed, I am anticipating that the ordination of three seminarians this spring will be at St. Mary's on Saturday, May 28, before we move out of the church.) In the mean-time before June, there is some structural support for the floor that needs to be added – this means adding some support pillars in the social room. Although the terrazzo floor we are adding is not substantially heavier, the structural engineer that we are working with is requiring this, so it will involve some minor disruptions in the social room in the next months. Thanks to Joe Steffl and the Building and Grounds Committee who have been helpful in executing and coordinating this project.

The company who is repairing the remaining stained glass windows in the sacristy and towers at St. Mary's is going to begin working on some of them in the next weeks. It will be great to see these repairs that are badly needed.

Lastly, I am hoping to have the money collected by May 31, for the other two big projects at St. Mary's that need to be done this summer – replacing the school elevator and the tuck-pointing on the church. The goal amounts and money that has already come in for these projects is in the bulletin at the bottom of the weekly stewardship section. Thanks to everyone who has already made a contribution to these maintenance projects! (A few weeks ago, someone from Texas gave an on-line donation to the tuck-pointing project along with a message saying that he remembered fondly his experience growing up in Sleepy Eye in the 1950's and wanted to contribute to the goal of making sure that St. Mary's is maintained for many years to come! There is a lot of fundraising that comes from many outside of our community who so generously contribute to the parish and school.)






