From Fr. Steffl:

Pastor This Sunday, January 23, the 7-8 pm holy hour at St. Mary's will be a Holy Hour for Life (and an end to abortion) including a Rosary and sung Divine Mercy Chaplet. I am hoping that the church will be full (with people from all 4 of our parish communities) as we pray for this most important issue of our times, asking the Lord to bring about a change of heart to the world and to our political leaders, moving them to protect the most vulnerable and helpless.

Next Sunday, January 30, we begin Catholic Schools Week. Each of our four parishes in our area at one time had a Catholic School, and we have so much to be grateful for, that we can continue to offer Catholic School education in our area at St. Mary's School. Next Sunday's Holy Hour (January 30), at St. Mary's will be for our benefactors, living and deceased, as well as to pray for our teachers, many of whom were also religious sisters. All of us can think back to a particular teacher who left a significant impression on us and helped us to become something more! A few weeks ago, I had a chance to go to the gathering of St. Mary's High School alumni called "Knights of Olde" (rescheduled from December because of bad weather). I have to say that I was very moved at hearing some of the memories that were shared with me from these men who were "formed" at St. Mary's. (We use the word "formed" rather than just educated, because that is the goal of our Catholic Schools - Christian formation - that goes beyond just learning facts but making Disciples of Jesus.) One fellow recounted to me that he remembered some extra attention he needed with math, and the Sister who taught him that subject who generously gave him as much time as the job took for him to "finally get it down." Another told me about how there were some weeks that he had money for lunch and others that he didn't. When the Sister in charge of the hot lunch program "caught on" to this, she made sure that he always had the necessary "token" to eat that day. Another mentioned that when he encountered some difficulties in later adulthood, that he could hear the advice of a Sister who taught him come back to his ears to help him in that moment. Many of our alumni, both local and those who have long since moved away from Sleepy Eye, have continued to contribute to our Annual Appeal and "pay it forward" as the phrase goes. I want to be able to make it possible for anyone who wants to attend St. Mary's to be able to do so, and am grateful for your help in making this a reality!

On a similar note, last week I wrote about wanting to be able to have the funds raised by May 31, of this year for the St. Mary's Church tuck-pointing and replacement of the school elevator. A donation of \$1000 for the tuck-pointing came in electronically from someone whose childhood was in Sleepy Eye in the 1950's and wrote a moving note about remembering being able to grow up in the "shadow of the bell towers" so that he was moved to send this money so others could share in the gift that he was given.

Last week, I visited with an alumna of St. Mary's who has lived as an adult in the Twin Cities area. She mentioned that her parish priest is a convert to the Catholic Faith who eventually followed a vocation to the priesthood. Growing up as a "cradle Catholic" she said she is thankful for him helping her to understand better some of the things that she "took for granted" and didn't really appreciate as much as she should have. It is true that we as Catholics don't always love as much as we should because we have always had them, whereas those who don't have the privilege of growing up Catholic have to search for the Truth (and sometimes have to give up much to embrace the Catholic Faith) and show a much deeper love of the Church! This Sunday, the 2nd grade students from our parishes are making their First Confessions. This Sacrament, often underappreciated and under-utilized is the "key" to taking a deeper step into our relationship with Jesus, the Divine Physician. Please join me in praying for these children, their families, and for a renewed love and appreciation of that Sacrament of Confession, that so often we make much harder than it really is! And for a more general appreciation, love, and use of this Sacrament in our parishes!






Catholic School Week Collection






