Pastoral Musings: Spirit of Unity in Diversity



"There are different spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit" (*1 Cor* 12:4), as the Apostle Paul writes to the Corinthians. He continues: "There are different forms of service, but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone" (vs. 5-6). Diversity and unity: Saint Paul brings together two words that seem contradictory. He wants to tell us that the Holy Spirit is the *one* who brings together the *many* and that the Church was born this way on the day of Pentecost: we are all uniquely different yet united by the same Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit manifested in the hearts and minds of the disciples in the form of a fiery tongue and mighty wind when they huddled together in the upper room for fear of the Jews. Jesus told them to wait for the promise of the Father, the Holy Spirit until they are clothed with power from on high. Indeed, the apostles and disciples who waited for 50 days in prayer experienced the most powerful movement of the Spirit on the day of Pentecost. Although they were so different in professions and temperament, they felt a deep sense of unity and concord that even though they spoke different languages, they understood one another and many people from different cultural and ethnic backgrounds were drawn together by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. There were simple fishermen, educated tax collectors, homemakers, and many diverse people. At Pentecost, the Apostles understand the unifying power of the Spirit. They see it with their own eyes when everyone, though speaking in different languages, comes together as one people: the people of God, shaped by the Spirit, who weaves unity from diversity and bestows harmony because in the Spirit, there *is* harmony.

Holy Spirit is the ultimate gift from which all other blessings flow and flourish. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and spiritual gifts or inner gifts need to be awakened by the power of prayer and meditation. When hate crimes and mass shootings happen, we know that this is coming from the opposite of the Holy Spirit, the evil Spirit that divides and hates and destroys life. When people engage in war and domination, we know that it is not coming from the Holy Spirit but rather from the power of the diabolical Spirit. We need to invoke the power of the Holy Spirit to stop divisions, hatred, and violence.

Let us now focus on ourselves, the Church of today. We can ask ourselves: "What is it that unites us? What is the basis of our unity?" We all have strong opinions and fiercely defend them even at the cost of unity and concord. Or we refrain from expressing them for fear of being misunderstood or alienated. When the Spirit comes, Jesus tells us that it will teach us everything and bring us to greater wisdom and understanding of the truth in a given situation. Respectful dialogue and open discussions are necessary to discern the work of the Spirit within a family and community.

The first disposition of the Pentecost is prayerful unity amid diversity and differences. Today, this sense of spiritual unity and concord is necessary to solve everyday challenges and gain support for more remarkable growth. The first task of the Pentecost is the Proclamation of the good news of Christ. The Spirit does not want the memory of the Master to be cultivated in small groups locked in upper rooms where it is easy to "nest." This terrible disease can also infect the Church: making her into a nest instead of a community, a family, or a Mother. The Spirit himself opens doors and pushes us to press beyond what has already been saying and done, beyond the precincts of a timid and wary faith. How is the Spirit nudging us today? How do we experience a new Pentecost?
