

### **Pastoral Musings: The Sacrament of Real Presence**



#### Dear Friends,

It's good to reflect on the real significance of the Corpus Christi Feast that we celebrate this weekend. Corpus Christi is also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, a celebration of Jesus Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist. Every Mass is a participation in and celebration of this sacrifice but the feast of the Corpus Christi is an occasion to be especially aware of the gift of Christ's real and abiding presence in the world. In today's world, people question the meaning of real presence and think its just symbolic. Saints have realized the greater depth of this mystery of the Sacrament of the abiding presence of Christ. St. Maximillian Kolbe said, "If angels could be jealous of men, they would be so for one reason: Holy Communion".

I used to use the analogy of the "wedding ring" to bring home to the first communion kids the preciousness and the beauty of the Body and Blood of Christ and its mystical transformation. I asked the kids, "what does the wedding ring look like before the wedding?" They tell me that "it's a piece of metal". Indeed, it's true. "And once the wedding takes place, what happens to this metal?" It is transformed into a wonderful ring that signifies the great and lasting love between the husband and wife, the Mom and Dad. The change is internal and no one considers it as a piece of metal any more after the wedding ceremony. It's held very precious and it evokes sweet memories of the wedding day and the lasting love and fidelity of marriage. In the similar way after the consecration of the bread and wine, it is no more bread and wine. It is transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ signifying the Holy Sacrifice of Christ for the sake of the world and its redemption. Let us approach the altar with this renewed sense of the real presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

I have heard from many parishioners what a great meaning and joy it is for them to come and take part in the Holy Eucharist and receive the Holy Communion and it brings great peace and joy to their heart and soul. Communion is always a reunion with the Lord that brings joy and peace to our souls. I recall people expressed their deep longing to receive the most holy body and blood of Christ during the days of the pandemic and they were not able to come to Mass and take part in the communion. I vividly remember the day when the restrictions were lifted for celebrating Mass and people came to the communion after a long time. Returning from the Mass there were tears of joy on their faces and hearts full of gratitude. Mother Theresa used to tell the priest, "Celebrate Mass every day as if it is your first and last mass and then you will be fully present and you can feel the real presence of Christ in the bottom of your heart". As we celebrate this great solemnity of Corpus Christ it his weekend, let us prepare our hearts and minds to receive the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ with a renewed sense of anticipation and feel the joy of the real presence of Christ in us and carry that luminous presence all through the day.

We have many reasons to be grateful this week especially for all our fathers who protect, provide and set examples for their children. The greatest gift that my father gave me was that he loved and cared for me and the entire family and believed in our future.


