Pastoral Musings: Eternal Life through Acts of Kindness



While serving in Wisconsin a decade ago, I had four deacons, and one of them was extraordinary in showing compassion for the one in dire need or hurting in any way. Deacon Bill Miller was the Police Chief in Chicago, and he felt a strong call from the Lord and decided to serve the Lord and Church and took early retirement from Law Enforcement duty. His primary focus was sharing the compassionate care of the Lord with the people who were in most need. Many a time, I have seen him sitting down with a homeless man on the outskirts of the Church, and he does not mind spending long times and days with people in need until they are in a better place. We prayed about how best we could mobilize the local community and parish to create a homeless shelter, for many were sleeping on the street, especially during summer days. Although he was a big man both physically and in his stature as Police Chief in a big city, he was down to earth and very approachable; ,he reached out to people where they were. I recall in 2011, he came to the parish in Woodruff and took me to his parish amid Wisconsin winter and continuous snowfalls. He established a crisis fund and a team with other area Churches to go in rotation to visit families in need and provide support and help.

Whenever I read the story of the Good Samaritan, Deacon Bill comes to my mind and brings good memories and inspiration to serve the Lord with kindness and compassion, especially for those in need. The Good Samaritan story is one of the most beloved stories of Jesus. It encourages us to be unselfish, ready to help people in dire situations without hesitation, and go the extra mile. The parable of the Good Samaritan is precipitated by and in answer to a question posed by a lawyer: "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" (Lk 10:25). This question provoked a response from Jesus with a story of the Good and kind Samaritan. The report defines Jesus's disciples' relationship with the Neighbor, especially those in need. The Samaritan is the least likely to have shown compassion but has shown the highest level of empathy. People do not care how much you know, but they do care how much you care. Caring Love is the simple and profound way to find eternal life. Deacon Bill Miller was a Good Samaritan whose acts of kindness continue to shed the fragrance of Christ's love from heaven.

Martin Luther King reflected on the behavior of the characters: "The first question, the priest and Levite asked was: If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me? But... the good Samaritan reversed the question: If I do not stop to help this man, what will happen to him?"

The lessons of these parables are three-fold:

1. We should set aside our prejudice and show love and compassion for others.

2. Our Neighbor is anyone you encounter; we are all creatures of one Creator, and we learn to welcome and love all people as another Christ.

3. Eternal life is not a pie in the sky, but it begins with an act of kindness. Kindness is the name of the religion for Jesus. Without kindness and compassion, one cannot enter the Kingdom of God.

To feel the love divine: Do an act of kindness every day without any strings attached. Reach out to someone you do not know in the Church or someone going through hard times.

Pope Francis urged, "Like the Good Samaritan, may we not be ashamed of touching the wounds of those who suffer, but try to heal them with concrete acts of love."


