FATHER'S LETTER

Today I have to write about a very serious matter, the Eucharist. Unfortunately we had a host that was dropped on the ground in the pews a few weeks ago. I do not know what the motivation was, or how it happened, my hope is some sort of simple error. Either way, this is something we MUST take very seriously.

Every host and every particle of a host is the entirety of Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. We must respect it. A couple of things that may help us in the future to avoid such a situation again.


First, parents, be sure to talk to your children about the Eucharist. This happened while I was gone, and there is a chance that a child received their first communion without a parent noticing, and not being sure what to do with the host, or "trying" it and not caring for the taste took it back out of their mouth. So please, if you have children that are at the age of wanting to receive the Eucharist, but are not yet ready to do so, please help with keeping an eye on them and having good conversations.

Along this point, sometimes a child knows they need to go to confession before they receive communion and they are not sure how to go about it. In the innocence of youth, mistakes happen. Please have a conversation regarding frequency of confession, or having a safe way where your child could approach you and admit they need to go to confession without fear of other punishment. Due to my state, I will not tell you what that needs to look like, but would encourage trying to remove those obstacles to this beautiful Sacrament.

Second, without being a watchdog, be vigilant. Hopefully Godforbid, but if you were to see this again, please be sure to approach a deacon or myself as soon as possible so that we can properly take care of the host. If you see something suspicious, please bring it to our attention.

Third, pray. We need to constantly be praying for those who may lack understanding, for whatever reason, of the gravity of what has happened. It might be very innocent and just an act of ignorance, or it may have been more malicious, either way, prayer can go a long way to keep something bad from becoming something worse.

Let us thank the Lord for His gift of the Eucharist and pray that we may all grow in appreciation of this gift!



General Rules

- Always treat people with disabilities as equals.
 Never be afraid, skeptical, or embarrassed to approach someone with a disability.
- Always ask before you help. People with disabilities have varying levels of independence.
- Never assume someone does or does not have a disability. Everyone is different.
- Do not stare. Simply view them the way you view others.
- Respect and understand confidentiality. People with disabilities have a right to privacy. They are not obligated to tell you about their disability.


