


Dear Friends:

**“Why do we Catholics do what we do at Mass?” I would like to explain a small act or ritual done during Mass which many people probably don’t know its meaning or significance or why it is done.**

During Mass, at the moment of praying or singing “The Lamb of God”, the priest breaks the host (Eucharistic Bread), and places a small piece in the chalice containing the precious blood. While doing this, the priest says inaudibly: *“May this mingling of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it.”* This act and ritual symbolizes the unity of the living Body of Christ. This is the “co-mingling” of the Body and Blood of Christ. It is a small act, but rich in symbolism. **One**, it symbolizes the Resurrection of our Lord: during the consecration our Lord comes to the bread and wine separately – “this is my Body”, “this is the chalice of my Blood”; symbolic of His death on the cross. At the co-mingling, the two (body and blood) are joined. **Two**, it symbolizes the unity of the Church. In the early Church, after the Pope’s Mass, designated people (acolytes) would be given parts of the Eucharistic Bread that had just been consecrated at the Pope’s Mass and they would take it out to other parishes in the city. The priests there would then put it into the chalice at the Mass they were celebrating thus signifying unity and communion with the Pope’s Mass and with all the other Masses celebrated in the city: they were all one Body of Christ. This piece of Eucharistic Bread was called the fermentum, a Latin word that means leaven. **Three**, later in the Christian world, the priests would take a piece of the consecrated bread (sancta) and place it on the altar at the time of the breaking of bread. At the next Mass, this (sancta) would be put into the chalice as a sign of unity and continuity from one Mass to another, until the kingdom comes, in other words, Mass is not a closed club! BUT now, today, this action symbolizes the fact that after the Resurrection, the Lord’s body and blood are united and cannot be separated - a sense of unity, continuity and solidarity. As you witness the “breaking of the bread,” try to meditate on the Lord’s Presence before you. This is the moment of decision for each of us: will our eyes open to His Presence? Are we blind to what we are about to partake in? Has our ability to receive Him so freely dulled our senses? Ask the Lord to open your eyes to the miracle of His Presence in the consecrated bread and wine that have been offered at this Mass. The priest then raises the host and chalice and, presenting Jesus to us, uses the words from Scripture. He declares that this is the “Lamb of God” and how blessed are we who are called to partake in His supper. We respond to this invitation by declaring that we are unworthy. We use words directly from the Scriptures. Please refer to and read the following: John 1:29, Revelation 19:9 and Luke 7:1-10. When a centurion of the Roman army begged Jesus to heal his servant, Jesus accepted to go to the centurion’s house and heal the servant. The centurion answered him, “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but say the word and let my servant be healed.” We make this our answer each time we receive Christ in the Eucharist. And how this word is true! No one among us - absolutely no one - is worthy to receive the Body of Christ. Only Christ, by His word which purifies and sanctifies, can make us worthy to receive Him. Therefore we implore Him: “Only say the word and my soul shall be healed.”

### **Something(s) to think about:**

One of Lyndon Johnson’s favorite stories from his Texas hill country concerned a man who always slept through the sermon at church. “Every Sunday,” according to the president, “he’d come and get in the front row and sleep all during the sermon. Finally, the preacher got a little irritated, and one Sunday, he said, ‘All you people who want to go to heaven, please rise!’ Everyone stood up except this one man, who was sound asleep, as usual. When the congregation sat down, the preacher said in a very loud voice, calculated to wake the sleeper, ‘Now, all of you who want to go to hell, please stand up!’ The man jumped up. He looked around him, in back of him; he looked at his wife, and she was sitting down; at his children, and they were sitting down. He looked at the preacher, somewhat frustrated, and said, ‘Preacher, I don’t know what it is we are voting on, but you and I seem to be the only two who are for it.’ ”

There is an old tale about Satan walking in the Streets of Life, sulking in the shadows with his hunting dogs, the little imps of human weakness. A person came walking down the Street, Satan said to a little imp: “Go, get that one for me!” Quickly the imp crossed the street, silently and lightly hopped to the person’s shoulder and whispered, “You are discouraged!” The person said, “No. I am not discouraged.” The imp insisted, “You are discouraged.” The person replied, “I don’t think I am.” Louder and more decidedly the imp repeated, “I tell you, you are discouraged.” The person murmured: “Well, I suppose I am.” The little imp darted back to Satan and said proudly, “I’ve got that one.” Another person passed again and old Satan sent the imp. The proud little imp repeated his tactics but the person replied emphatically, “No.” The second time the person replied, “I tell you I am not discouraged!” The third time the person said, “You lie! I am not discouraged.” The person walked down the street going straight for the light. The little imp returned to his master, crestfallen, “I couldn’t get that one,” he reported. “After three attempts the person called me a liar, and that discouraged me!”



## **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months. Baptismal requests must be made at least one month before the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

## **SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY**

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months before a date can be requested, with a minimum of six months for marriage preparation. The couple needs to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. If a prior marriage is involved; one year notice is necessary.

## **PASTORAL VISITATIONS**

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers, and desires Holy Communion or a visit. If a homebound parishioner would like a pastoral visit, or to receive the Eucharist, call the parish office.

**Our Lady of Mount Carmel** is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order - Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th to mid-13th century. There they built a chapel dedicated to the Blessed Virgin. Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the *Brown Scapular*. Traditionally, Mary is said to

have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named St. Simon Stock (1165-1265). The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment and is both a sign and pledge. A **sign** of belonging to Mary; a **pledge** of her motherly protection, not only in this life but after death. It signifies three elements: first, belonging to a religious family particularly devoted to Mary, especially dear to Mary, the Carmelite Order; second, consecration to Mary, devotion to and trust in her Immaculate Heart; third, an urge to become like Mary by imitating her virtues, above all her humility, chastity, and spirit of prayer. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance. ***Our Lady of Mount Carmel pray for us.***
