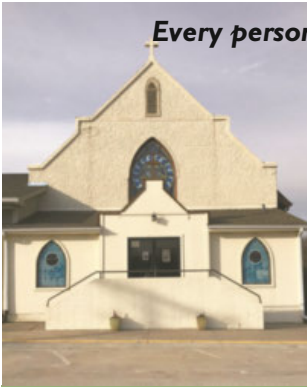
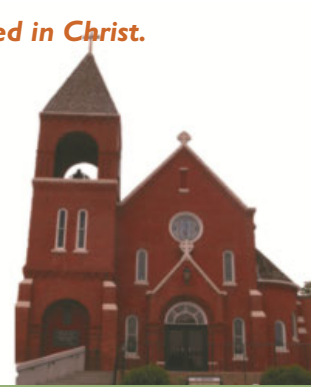

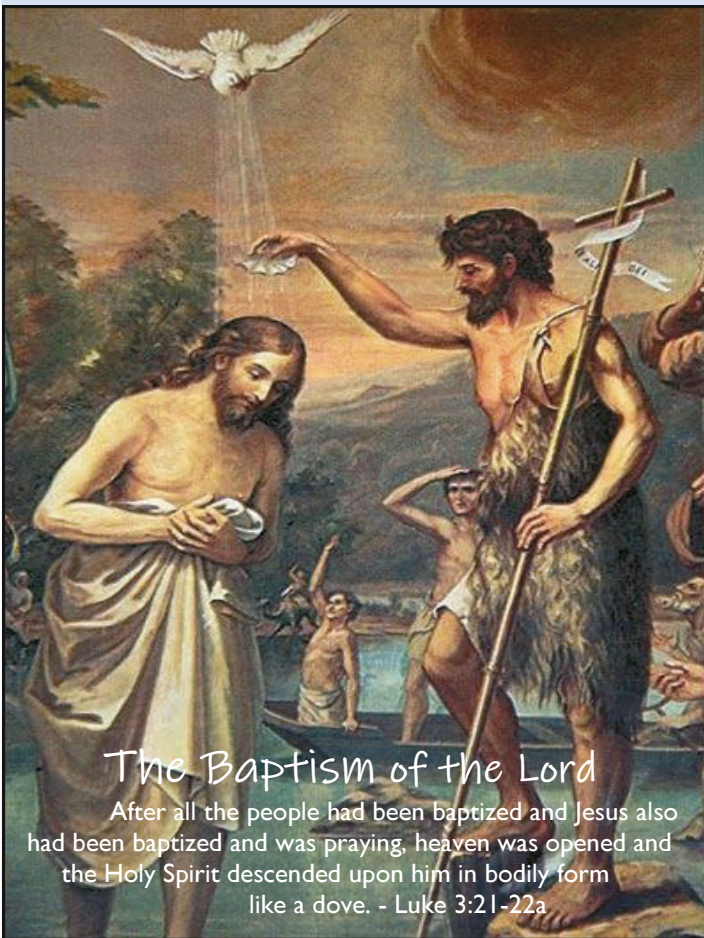

JANUARY 8 & 9, 2022

Dear Friends:

Next weekend (January 15/16, 2022) our two parishes will welcome and host Rev. Dennis Martin who will be with us to celebrate Masses and tell us about the work of Unbound. Unbound is a lay Catholic sponsorship ministry that helps children and elderly in 19 countries around the world. Originally it was known as Christian Foundation for Children, then it became Christian Foundation for Children and Aging, then in 2014 it became Unbound. It is an international nonprofit founded by lay Catholics grounded in the Gospel call to put the needs of the marginalized and vulnerable first. It builds relationships of mutual respect and support that bridge cultural, religious and economic divides inviting all people of goodwill to join. Working side by side with people of diverse faith traditions in 19 countries, Unbound brings people together to challenge poverty in new and innovative ways. It inspires confidence and offers opportunity and encouragement to children and families living on the margins of society. It creates practical and trustworthy means for people to help others and nurture human connections that uplift all. Unbound sponsorship goes beyond distributing material goods and empowers families to become self-sufficient. Families - those with both parents in the home and those headed by one parent or a guardian - are the pillars of a strong, supportive community. It provides the opportunity for the sponsor and sponsored friend to make a real connection that gives hope and meaning to both. This connection opens a window between the two worlds and reveals the bonds that tie us together as one human family. By creating a true exchange of cultures, understanding and love as equals, Unbound does more than alleviating material poverty, it also creates the bonds of lasting peace and unity among people of diverse faiths and backgrounds. The mission of Unbound is to walk with the poor and marginalized of the world, providing personal attention and direct benefits to children, youth, aging and their families so they may live with dignity, achieve their desired potential and participate fully in society. We look forward to welcoming Unbound to our two parishes.

I thank you all for participating in **Project Emmanuel – 2021 Advent Project**. Thank you for the food, and the many and numerous other items, donations and contributions to The Harrison County Food Pantry, and The West Central Community Action. When all is said and done, this is one of the most important missions of the Church: not just thinking of others but actually going out of our way to help them. It is in this spirit that I want to thank you as Church for your participation in this project and making it such a big success. You have continually demonstrated how big-hearted you all are. May The Good Lord always bless and take care of you. Thank you for sharing and making Christmas beautiful for many. I wish to conclude with the following apt story.

An ugly, grayish-green frog squatted disconsolately on a drifting lily pad. Like so many of us, he didn't really know where he was drifting to, and he really didn't care anymore. To him, life had no purpose or reason. He was sick of being ugly and of having no dreams. As you can imagine, he was also tired of eating flies. Eventually he drifted toward shore, and there on the bank stood a beautiful princess - who, as we shall see, was a rather enlightened princess, with a strong stomach. She grabbed up the astonished frog and asked him, "Are you one of those frogs that used to be a prince until a spell was cast upon you?" "I haven't the froggiest notion," he replied. "Well, if you are," she said, "you will be restored as a prince if you're kissed by a beautiful princess like me." Thereupon, she kissed him right on his clammy green mouth. Talk about resuscitation! At once that squatty frog was six feet tall, handsome, intelligent, a young, upward mobile prince who had great happy plans for his life, including marriage to the princess. They lived happily ever after, of course, even though they became King and Queen. And all because of a beautiful kiss bestowed upon a homely lonely frog! "The duty of the Church is to kiss frogs." 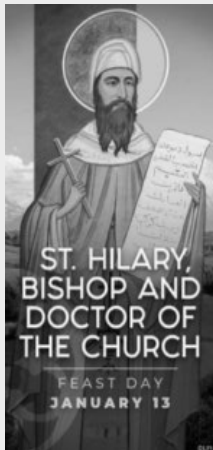

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK (ANOINTING)

Anointing is available upon request for serious illness, before surgery & in emergency any time.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months. Baptismal requests must be made at least one month before the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months before a date can be requested, with a minimum of six months for marriage preparation. The couple needs to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. If a prior marriage is involved; one year notice is necessary.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers, and desires Holy Communion or a visit. If a homebound parishioner would like a pastoral visit, or to receive the Eucharist, call the parish office.

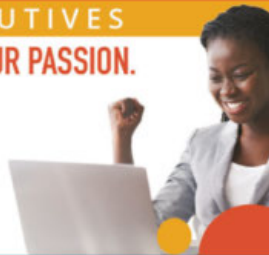
