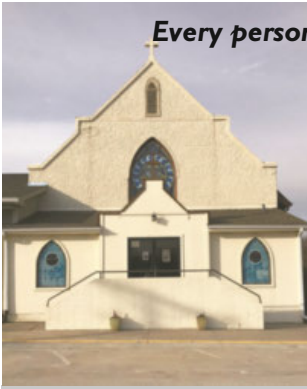
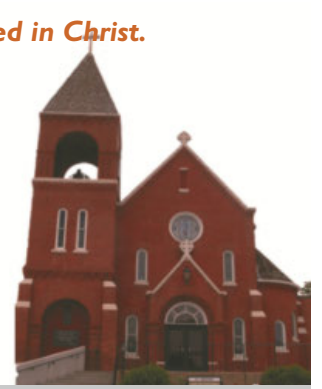

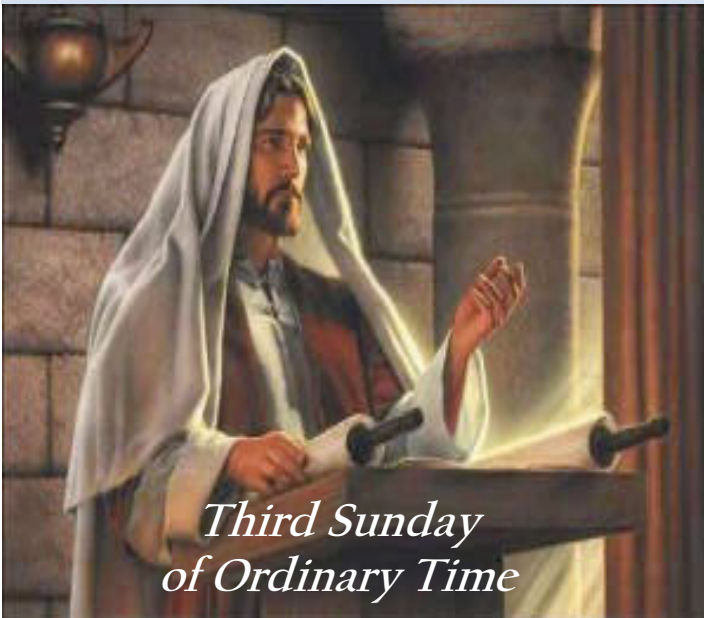

Dear Friends:

*More than any other book, the Bible offers an amazing collection of fascinating characters and personalities. They are all given different coverage and roles. Some, we know their names and not much more; some we might be just a bit hazy about. Some of these biblical personalities inspire us and enkindle our faith...*

### **Simon of Cyrene**

*“They pressed into service a passer-by, Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross” (Mark 15:21). This Simon is also mentioned in the gospels of Matthew (27:32), and Luke (23:26). Jesus had told his disciples that they must take up their cross, and follow him. He had not told them that one man, this Simon, would quite literally do just that. Having been scourged within an inch of his life, Jesus fell to the ground while carrying the bitter tree up the path to the place of his crucifixion, the Skull Place. Simon then bore the weight upon his own shoulders for a while, and so an ordinary man was granted the high honor of partaking of the sacrifice of his own Savior. It is an honor, then, and a duty, and a joy, granted in turn to every Christian wayfarer. Simon had come all the way from the coast of North Africa to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem; little did he know of what awaited him! He could not have known how profound a role he would play in the ultimate Passover. In his gospel, Saint Mark says that Simon is the father of Alexander and Rufus, naming them as if they were known friends. If so, then Simon too must have learned to follow Jesus in faith, after he had followed him in suffering. What can you learn from Simon?*

### **The Centurion at the Cross**

**Centurion: a Roman officer in charge of, and commanding 100 foot soldiers (“a century”).** This important Roman official is mentioned in the gospels of Mark (15:39), Matthew (27:54), and Luke (23:47). Let us hear it from the Centurion himself: “The day started out as usual. My squad and I were up early, getting ready for the day’s round of executions. One of the criminals had made a real ruckus lately – the whole city seemed to want his head on a platter. So we lit into him pretty good, then led him through the streets, glistening red in the sun. But he kept falling, so we yanked a foreigner out of the crowd (*Simon of Cyrene*) to get the beam up the hill. At noon we stuck him to the wood. That’s when the day started getting strange. First he said something to the one on his right: “Today you will be with me in Paradise” (Luke 23:43). It sounded like a door opening. I looked around, but nobody seemed to notice. People were jeering. My men were vying for his clothes. Then I looked over and saw his mother, with a teenager. “Woman, behold, your son” (John 19:26). That’s what I heard – this kid was now her son. The door inched open some more. What I heard next made me stagger: “Father, forgive them, they know not what they do” (Luke 23:34). Things were now out of hand. The door was moving, my heart was racing. The teenager looked over – suddenly he felt like my kid brother. That’s when it hit me: I wanted to be a son, a child again. I wanted my humanity back. Then he died. Pushing the door wide open, I cried, “This man was innocent beyond doubt. Truly this man was the Son of God!” (Mark 15:39; Matthew 27:54; Luke 23:47). For this Centurion, it was by little steps that he eventually exclaimed: “Truly this man was the Son of God.” What about yourself?

### **Something to think about:**

A farmer and his wife were expecting. When the doctor came to deliver the baby, he said he needed more light, so the farmer got a lantern from the barn. The doctor told him to bring the light closer. “Well,” the doctor said after a while, “you have a fine baby boy.” The farmer smiled. Then the doctor told him to bring the lantern close again. After a few more minutes, he announced another arrival – this time, a baby girl. The farmer began walking away with the lantern. “Where are you going?” the doctor asked. “I’m getting this light out of here,” the farmer replied. “I think it’s attracting them.”

Four shamefully proud mothers each had a son in the ministry. One mother boasted, “When my son walks into the room, everyone stands and says, ‘Good morning, Bishop’.” Not to be outdone, the second mother said, “When my son walks into the room, everyone stands and says, ‘Good morning, Archbishop’.” The third mother bragged, “When my son walks into a room, everyone kneels and says, ‘Good morning, Your Eminence’.” The fourth mother’s son was an ex-farm boy humbly serving a poor rural congregation. But she said, “My son stands 6-foot-7 and weighs 375 pounds. When he walks into the room, everyone looks up and says, ‘Oh, my Lord!’”

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months. Baptismal requests must be made at least one month before the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

## **SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY**

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months before a date can be requested, with a minimum of six months for marriage preparation. The couple needs to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. If a prior marriage is involved; one year notice is necessary.

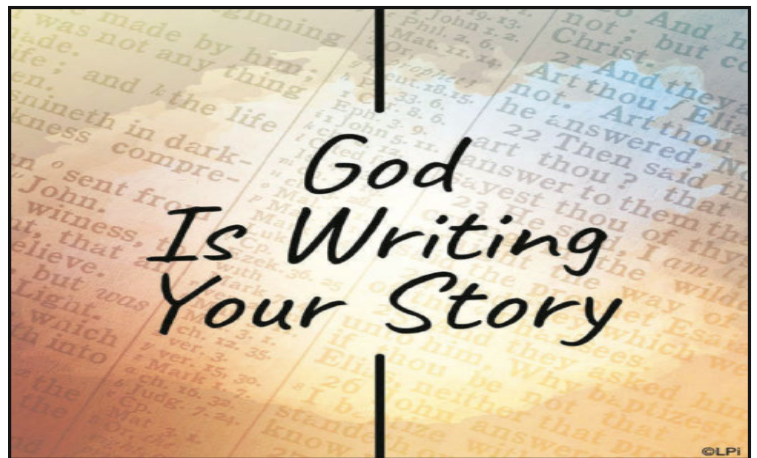

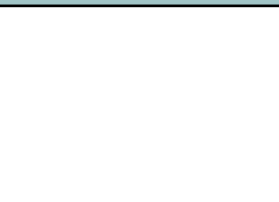
