

An Unexpected Awakening

I'm not sure what I expected, but the room with its cement floor, pre-fab walls, and one small window caused me to question my sanity. What in the world was I doing here? There was a single bed in one corner, and a straight-back chair facing a small table. There was a cross on the wall but no electricity There was an oil lamp and a camping restroom a hundred yards away. The cell phone connection was spotty. This was my first trip to the hermitage hidden in the woods of my sister's farm illusions rooted in Each year, the Church invites us to enter the desert, in Minnesota. I had decided spending time in a hermitage would be a meaningful way to begin the season of Lent. Now I wasn't so sure.

But as I looked around the room, I realized the bare-bones environment was intentional. There was nothing pleasant to look at, nothing to distract me. I could no longer run from God or hide behind work or family commitments. With nothing else to do, I took a deep breath, closed my eyes, and let the world around me disappear.

A cocoon-like silence enveloped me, I knew I stood on holy ground. In the hours that followed, I discovered that it wasn't the hermitage I was visiting that was holy. It was the hermitage that God was building inside me that was pure—a place I could carry with me long after I left the farm.

This unexpected awakening gave me a new perspective, which, in essence, is what Lent is all about.

The word Lent means "lengthening of days." It reminds us we have time to turn away from sin and fall in love with God. We begin by stripping away excuses for our sins. We strive to shed illusions rooted in the false self and enter the desert with

> Jesus, where we are given the opportunity to discover what can only be learned through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

> because once is never enough. Despite our best intentions, we grow weary, our resolve dissipates, and our baptismal robe becomes soiled. Hence, the penitential tone of Lent invites us to fast not only

from food but also from sin and all that may lead us astray. We recognize that we can't do this by ourselves and so we profess our weakness and ask God to create a clean heart in us and renew our commitment to practice good works.

Lent is serious business, but serious is not the same as gloomy. In fact, Lent can be a time of joyful consolation because the more we empty ourselves, the more God fills us with his mercy and grace. This is the good news with which we are called to begin our Lenten journey, because, according to St. Paul in 2 Corinthians 6:2, God affirms, "In an acceptable time I heard you, and on the day of salvation I helped you."

Saints among us

St. Joan of Arc

Joan of Arc is considered the heroine of France. She was the daughter of a tenant farmer at Domre'my on the borders of the duchies of Bar and Lorraine.

St. Joan of Arc was one of the most colorful saints ever. About the age of thirteen, she began to have visions of the Archangel Michael, Saint Margaret, and Saint Catherine of Alexandria. In these visions they told her to recover France from English control and reinstate Charles VII as its rightful king. This was a mission she should fulfill with divine purpose.

Joan never married as she had only one goal in life which was given her by the Angel and the Saints, which was an intensive prayer life, and the mission of returning Holy Mother Church, back from the English! Joan was fearless. The French army had been beaten down and was afraid to challenge the enemy. Amazingly, Joan powerfully changed them from fearfulness to becoming an army of the Lord. She inspired all the troops. One time she asked one of her soldiers if he had any sexual desires for her, and his answer was "no". Joan faithfully lead and inspired 'God's army'. She would even get the troops up in the middle of the night to advance on an enemy, but she would only do it after St. Michael or one of the Saints told her when to go to war.

Her greatest fear was to be burned at the stake, as they did with witches. She was captured by the Duke of Burgundy's men, and was jailed for more than a year. Then she was put on trial for charges including heresy, witchcraft and violating divine law for dressing like a man. She was declared guilty and burned at the stake on May 30th, 1431. And what did Joan of Arc shout out as she died? She called on her three favorite saints for help as she burned. Right before she lost consciousness, she yelled out: "Jesus!" Her enemies even had her burned twice, just to be sure she was dead.

She died at about 19 years of age, and was canonized as a Roman Catholic saint more than 500 years later, on May 16, 1920.

Joan of Arc held on to her faith to the very end! We may not be bold like her, but if we hold on to Jesus until our end, we can come to know her much better when we get to Heaven!


