

Saints Among Us

Saint Charbel Makhlouf

St. Charbel was born in 1828 into a family of five children. His father was a mule driver who died just a few years after Charbel was born. They lived in a small village located at the top of the highest Lebanese mountain. He was raised in a pious home, where Charbel was drawn to the lives of the Saints and to the life of a hermit. Charbel was responsible for caring for the family's small herd of cows. He would take the herd to a grotto nearby where he had put an icon of the Blessed Mother Mary, and that is where he would spend his day in prayer. In 1815, Charbel left his family and entered a Maronite Monastery of Our Lady where he became a monk.

St Charbel has performed hundreds of thousands of miracles when he was alive as a Catholic Monk and Hermit, and even more after his death on December 24, 1898 and to this current day in over 133 countries around the world. St Charbel has performed miracles to people that are sick, disabled, mentally ill and dying from various religions including Christians, Muslims, Buddhist, Hindus, Jewish, Atheists, etc., just to name a few.

The Monastery in Mount Lebanon receives hundreds of thousands of letters every year from people who want to share the great news of miracles, cures and wonders performed by St Charbel. This figure does not include the hundreds of thousands of email, phone calls, texts, face-book messages received by the monastery.

It will be virtually impossible to write and describe every miracle that St. Charbel has performed during and after his life. He was buried at his local Monastery on Christmas Day. It was reported that, during the transport of his corpse, the inclement weather conditions hindered the pallbearers in carrying out their duty.

"Father Charbel died on the eve of Christmas; the snow was heavy. We transferred him to the monastery on Christmas day. Before we moved him, the snow was falling rapidly and the clouds were very dark. When we carried him, the clouds disappeared, and the weather cleared." - Statement by one of the pallbearers

A few months after his death, a bright light was seen surrounding his tomb and the superiors opened it to find his body still intact. After that day, a blood-like liquid flowed from his body. Experts and doctors were unable to give medical explanations for the incorruptibility and flexibility. In the years 1950 and 1952, his tomb was opened again, and his body still had the appearance of life. Additionally, the 1950 TV recording shows that at this point St. Charbels' body was still intact, despite the grave becoming severely rusty.
