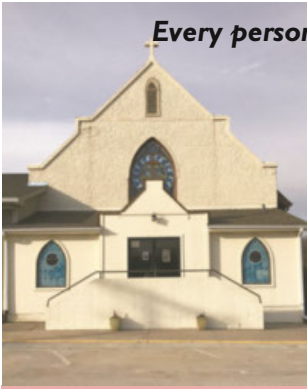
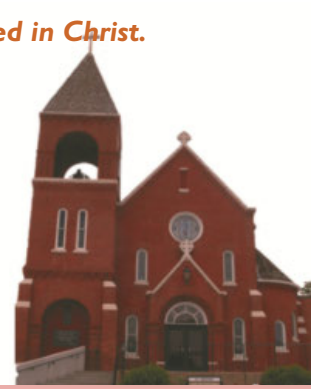

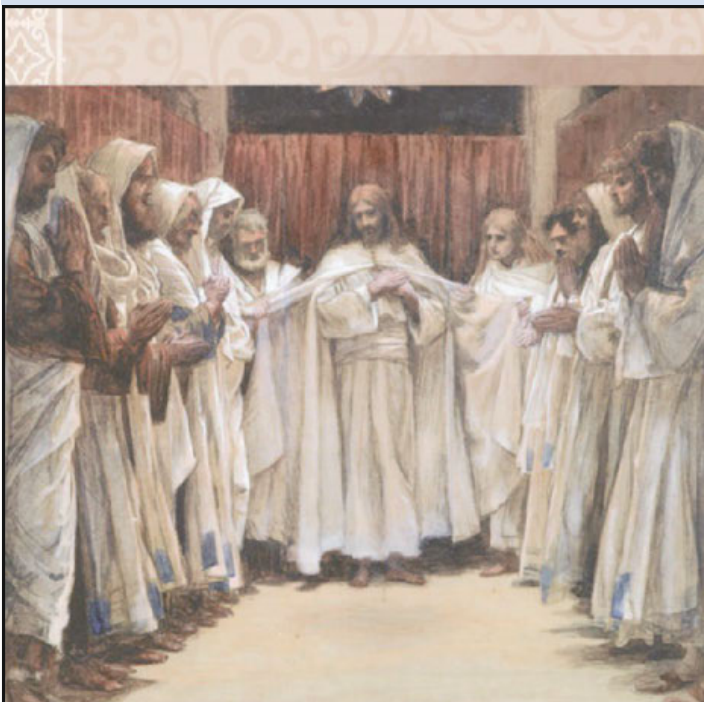

Saints Among Us

St. Patrick

St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was about fourteen he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to tend their sheep. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found some sailors who took him back to Britain and was reunited with his family.

A few years after returning home, Patrick saw a vision. He said, "I saw a man coming, as he was from Ireland. His name was Victoricus, and he carried many letters, and he gave one of them to me. The heading read: 'The Voice of the Irish.' As I read the letter, I sensed in that moment that I heard the voice of many people from the western sea... and they cried out to me as with one voice: 'We appeal to you, holy servant boy, to come and walk among us.'" The vision prompted him to become a priest. He was ordained by St. Germanus, and sent to bring the Gospel to Ireland.

Patrick loved God most dearly and he was soon spreading the Gospel of Jesus throughout the country! The Satanic Druids were desperate to get rid of Fr. Patrick, and wanted to kill him, so they called all the Druids together with a massive fire and many demonic spectacles as they planned to overcome the powerful prophet Patrick. However, Fr. Patrick was not afraid when he approached them with God's power, it was then that he brought an end to the Druids and their evil ways. He converted thousands of people and built many churches across the country.

He often used a shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity, and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering, he died March 17, 461. He died at Saul, which was the first church he had built. He is believed to be buried in Down Cathedral, Downpatrick. His grave was marked in 1990 with a granite stone. Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, whose love and total devotion to and trust in God should be a shining example to each of us. So complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission, he feared nothing—not even death. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland.

St. Patrick's Church is a result of this very holy Saint! St. Patrick, pray for us...

The world appears to be increasingly polarized, a condition that seems to have entered every aspect of life. The rich and the poor still exist, but the gap between them seems greater, and the middle class is disappearing. Polarization is found not only in the financial realm but increasingly in politics, business, family relationships, and even in the Church. Polarization is based on conflict and division. It is an overemphasis on the differences between people at the expense of the unity that makes us who we are as a community. The end result is radical individualism. This is not how the Church is supposed to be. We are not only called to have a personal relationship with God but a unifying relationship with one another. Although tension does exist, it can be beneficial. Diversity without division and unity without blind conformity allows us to grow without sacrificing fidelity. There is only one way to accomplish this healthy tension—the answer is through Jesus Christ.

If I recognize that I am not God, that I don't have all the answers, and that I don't set the standard by which the world is measured, I must begin to seek answers outside myself. I soon realize that other people in the world have different gifts, talents, views, and personalities. In an effort to understand and relate to this diversity, I am pushed to find some standard by which to measure reality.

Some conclude that such a standard doesn't exist and enter into a form of individual or cultural relativism. However, if we look to Jesus Christ and acknowledge him as the true Son of God, then we see we do have a standard who provides a unifying factor in the midst of diversity—

Christ. In an ecumenical dialogue (a conversation among Christians), the belief that Jesus Christ is the Messiah is the commonality in the discussion. By acknowledging who Jesus is, we recognize all Christians are brothers and sisters in Christ. This creates the possibility for an environment of mutual respect and dignity.

Although we may not agree, we can actively listen, continuously learn, and strive together to discover the truth within the fullness of the revelation of Jesus. Looking to Jesus for the answers we need in our world lays a foundation on which people of goodwill can exist in a healthy tension that seeks truth, allowing us to build community. The various gifts that each has to offer should make the community, the body of Christ, reflect Christ evermore. And this elevates individuals. The fullest expression of who we are exists in the midst of a community of people seeking the face of Jesus Christ in all we say and do.

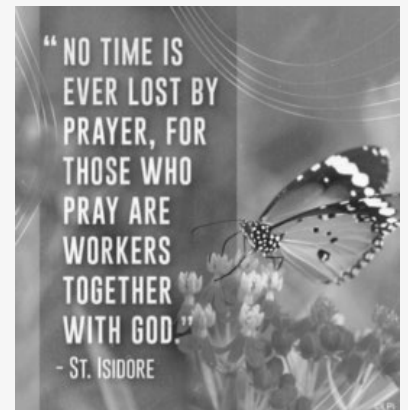

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months. Baptismal requests must be made at least one month before the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months before a date can be requested, with a minimum of six months for marriage preparation. The couple needs to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. If a prior marriage is involved; one year notice is necessary.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers, and desires Holy Communion or a visit. If a homebound parishioner would like a pastoral visit, or to receive the Eucharist, call the parish office.

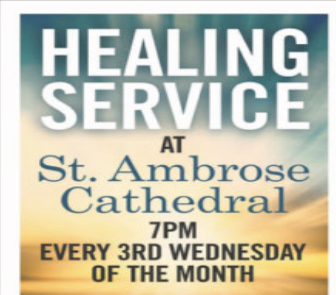
