PASTORAL REFLECTION

Yesterday we celebrated God's greatest gift to the world, the birth of his Son. Jesus was born into the world in a family. Today we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

In being born into a family, God wanted to point out to us the importance of a family as a child is growing up. The family can help the child develop a good self-image of him/herself. Within the family the child can fail at something and still feel loved and supportive.

In honoring family life today, it is good to reflect on what words we say to our children. For our children want to always please us. They don't want to disappoint us. They want us to be proud of them. So does your child hear from your lips positive or negative re-enforcement? You did your best. I am proud of you. Or do we find ourselves using the words "never" or "always" when we are talking to our children? You will never amount to anything. You are always letting me down.

I remember back in the early 80's when I was part of Bishop Licker's staff and living at the Pastoral Center in New Ulm. One winter, Community Education offered adult swimming lesson. Since I can hardly swim I decided to take swimming lesson.

One day there was a mother at the Vogel Area with her daughter who was about 3 or 4 years old and taking swimming lessons. The mother was yelling at her daughter, "You will never be able to do anything right; you can't even keep your head under water. You are an embarrassment to your dad and me."

As she was saying those words to her daughter, I was thinking how glad I was that she was not my mother because I have a hard time keeping my head under water. How often do we find ourselves yelling at our kids when they have done something wrong? They probably need to be yelled at but do we also stop to compliment them when they do something good?

Years ago I saw a plague or poster that contained some very good words of wisdom. It was a poem written by a Dorothy Law Nolte, Ph. D. and is entitled, *Children Learn What They Live*. The poem contains nineteen lines but I have chosen these lines to give you a sense of what she says. "If children live with criticism, they learn to condemn; with hostility, they learn to fight; with shame, they feel guilty; with encouragement, learn confidence; with praise, learn appreciation; with approval, learn to like themselves; with acceptance, learn to love." To check out the entire poem go to the Internet and type in her name or the words "If children live with...."

As we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we honor our families as well. By being born into a family, Jesus made holy family life. However, Jesus' family was not a perfect family even though we think it is the one family that got it right; that's why we call it the Holy Family.

Think for a moment what we know. Two of the three never sinned. There was no sibling rivalry. This family seemingly had it made. Yet Scripture tells us even the Holy Family was not as holy as we have images of it. Mary was an unwed mother-to-be and surely no less a struggle and social problem in the first century as it is today. Scripture does not name Mary's parents, much less give us an account of their response to Mary's good news.

The Holy Family's struggles are unmistakably present in the three-year cycle of Gospels for this feast. One year we hear Luke's account of Joseph and Mary presenting Jesus to God in the temple. The good news that Jesus was God's promised salvation to the entire world was quickly followed by Simeon's terrifying words to Mary: "This child is to be a sign that will be contradicted – and you yourself a sword will pierce."

Another year we hear the account of the Holy Family fleeing into Egypt. Exiled, they were refugees in a strange land, as are many families today.

This year we hear the Passover pilgrimage to Jerusalem when Jesus was twelve years old. Jesus became separated from Joseph and Mary for three days before they finally found him in the temple listening to the teachers and wowing them with his answers. We don't hear Mary as a proud parent say, "That's our boy!" when they finally find him safe and sound. Rather, the first words of Mary are, "Why have you done this to us?" Any parent who has been filled with great anxiety over a child coming home late knows the question was not whispered gently.

In many ways, the life of the Holy Family was just like ours, ordinary and messy at times. That life was blessed and holy, and so too is our family lives. Granted we all fall short but we learn and grow. May your family be blessed this day.

On Monday I will be leaving to drive to Florida for the winter. My sister, Karen, will be driving with me and I will fly her home once we get to Panama City Beach. I ask for your prayers for safe travels going and coming. See you at the end of March. Please stay safe and healthy.

2021 Contributions: To receive tax credit for the 2020 tax year donations must be dated and postmarked no later than December 31, 2020. The parish offices will recognize donations dated in 2020 as 2020 contributions as long as they are delivered to the office no later than noon, *Monday, January 3, 2022*. This cut off will allow us to process all parishioner contribution statements in a timely manner.

Thank you to our sponsors: Dirks – Blem Funeral Services, Knights of Columbus 2000, St. Mary's Catholic United Financial Council, Councils of Catholic Women from our three parishes, for providing these 2022 Catholic calendars.

ST. MARY'S NEWS

Fall Collection: Our goal for this years Fall Collection is **\$65,000**. An envelope was included in your stewardship packet on November 14. You may also donate online or place your donation in an envelope labelled "Fall Collection". This collection replaces a parish dinner and festival/bazaar that many parishes have for a major fundraiser. Please be generous in your giving! So far we have received \$46,528.64 towards this collection, which is 71.58 % of our goal. Because of the bulletin deadline, we do not have the collection for Dec. 19 weekend included in this amount.

ST. MARY'S SCHOOL NEWS

\$25,000 Matching Grant: Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation \$25,000 Challenge Matching Grant

St. Mary's School has been presented with an incredible opportunity to receive a \$25,000 matching grant from the Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation. This Challenge Matching Grant requires our school to raise \$25,000 by December 31, 2021. If we were to raise \$25,000, the Schulz Foundation would match the \$25,000, which then totals \$50,000 back to our school!

Donations from either first-time donors or an "increased" monetary donation from current donors can contribute to this challenge. To clarify, gifts from first-time donors will count towards the challenge or if current donors raise their donation amount from their last gift, only the increased dollar amount will count towards the challenge. This is an "all-or-nothing" challenge. So if we don't raise \$25,000 by December 31st, we do not receive any matching grant money.

All 13 Catholic schools in the New Ulm Diocese have been presented with this Challenge Matching Grant. In addition, the Diocese of New Ulm's Office of Catholic Schools has also been presented with a \$50,000 Challenge Matching Grant with the same conditions. If all of the 13 Catholic schools and the diocese meet their goal, the diocese, as a whole, would receive \$750,000 in matching grant money. Dr. Michelle Kramer, director of the Office of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of New Ulm states, "the money would support marketing and enrollment initiatives and would also allow for ongoing training for teachers, particularly in assisting them to adapt instruction to meet the needs of individual students be working with standardized test data and through the use of instructional technology."

The Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation was created in 2004 by Dick Schulze, who is a Minnesota native and also the founder of Best Buy. He and his family want to give back to the communities where he and his family grew up. "Schulze and his family believe that a good education, a supportive family and a strong work ethic prepare children for a successful future."
