The Back Page

Holy Week is <u>the</u> week of all weeks in the Church Year. Beginning with Palm Sunday, it moves into the Easter Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday—and then we have Easter Sunday. From our directives:

"What really do the liturgies of the triduum celebrate? Most all of us believe we know the answer. We assume that Thursday commemorates the day Jesus instituted the Eucharist; Friday commemorates the day he was executed on the cross; and the vigil commemorates his emergence from the tomb. We assume, further, that the liturgies of these days are dramatic "reenactments" of events—by turns touching, tragic and triumphant - which happened during Jesus' last days and culminated in his victory over death.

"But is "history" the central focus of celebration during the Triduum? These events can't be "reenacted." That is why the church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of the assembly's *liturgical/sacramental celebrations.* What the paschal triduum actually celebrates is mystery, not history. The liturgies of these days do not "take us back" to the upper room or the path to *Calvary. Their ultimate purpose is not to retrace* or relive the last hours of Jesus' life—nor to catch sight of him emerging from the tomb at Easter's dawning. They celebrate not what once happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God's taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community broken like bread for the world's life—a community rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and fearless in the search for justice and peace.'

Yes, Holy Week—<u>the week</u> of all weeks in the Church Year. I encourage you to go to Living Stations this Wednesday in Miller. Go to Holy Thursday Mass in Highmore or Miller. (See schedule.) Go to Services on Good Friday. (See schedule.) Go to the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. (This Mass is not suitable for small children, as it is longer than usual. It would not be good for older children who have trouble behaving during Mass either. As for older, well behaved children—yes! Bring them! Introduce them to this wonderful liturgy!) And if <u>you</u> have never gone to the Easter Vigil, go this year. As an adult, practicing Catholic, you should know what the Vigil is.

Keep up your Lenten sacrifices this week—right up until after the Vigil. And then, roll away the stone! Happy Easter!
