

Merry Christmas!

"Be not afraid; for behold I bring you good new of great joy which will come to all people; for you is born this day in the city of David a savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk. 2: 10-11).

These were the words of the angels to the shepherds in Bethlehem, who were keeping watch over their flock by night. They receive the good news of the birth of their savior. And they set out immediately to Bethlehem to see for themselves and adore the God child born to redeem them. Over two thousand years later, we too are blessed to hear the news of great joy that, the Divine son born in Bethlehem continues invite us to see His glory and worship him. What a wonderful feeling it is to kneel before this manger and "Ponder everything God has done for us" – God loves us so much that he gives us His only Son, so that we may have life, have it abundantly". Is there anything in the world that can surpass such an act of love and generosity?

After seeing the God child, St. Joseph and the blessed Mother, the shepherds went home "Glorifying God for all they had heard and seen". Imagine what it would have been like one of those shepherds and how much their lives must have been changed by this experience! I am absolutely baffled by this trend. For ever since I came to St. John Vianney seven years ago, we never had an issue like this. You have all been extremely generous with your giving. So much so, that I have never had to bring up the subject before you. Even during COVID, we almost completely met our budget goals. But now this trend really surprises me. So, if you have not been giving in the past or have cut out your donations, I invite you to please consider giving now to our parish. There are many of you who stepped in immediately this past week to make an extra donation. A heartfelt thank you for that generosity. I further invite all of you who donate regularly to consider increasing your giving at least by 5% so that we can return to being strong financially, a key to our survival as a parish.

Here is how you can give to our parish:


Give electronically (see the form in the Bulletin).

- IRA charitable rollover: A great planning tool if you are age 70 1/2 or older is to give money from an IRA directly to charity. This is called a "qualified charitable distribution (QCD). This is an option if you wish to lower the taxable balance of an IRA, or if you are age 72 or older and you don't need the money from your required minimum distribution (RMDs). Donating through a QCD is a good way to avoid paying taxes on the money you withdraw while helping a qualified charity. The money must go directly from the IRA to a charity to ensure the distribution doesn't count toward your taxable income for the year.

I have great hope that the Lord sees and cares for our every need. He is never outdone in generosity and knows the sacrifices each of us makes in being generous.

Thank you for your generosity so that St. John Vianney parish can continue to serve you and all the parishioners into the immediate future and beyond. May God bless you and your loved ones abundantly this Christmas season and every day of the New Year!
