It is the second Sunday of Lent already, and we are almost through February. Maybe the thaw this week comes a bit too early to get us excited about Spring, but in terms of our Liturgical season, we are moving forward nicely.

The account of the Transfiguration of Christ is a revelatory event given to the four disciples present with Him that teaches and assures them not only of His power and authority, but His relation with the Father. It is also a microcosm of the broad, universal, and yet very specific ways that God teaches each of us.

God engages in a long process of revelation and training in the ways of His love and Eternal Law that are imparted through the Ten Commandments, the testimony of the Prophets, the tribulations of unfaithful Israel and the Incarnation of Christ. Not only does His revelation provide the basis for our moral orientation towards God and the root of just society, it enables us to know of God's love and His loving purpose for us.

Despite the past year we have endured, we are privileged to live in this time of Salvation History. Revelation and the theology of the Church, as revealed through Christ and Sacred Scripture, are mature. We have been graced with a way of Being that is undeniable.

The covenants of the Old Testament and the Incarnation of Christ reveal that God is not far removed from His creatures, nor is He a God who sits back and lets it all be. He didn't just give us rules to be followed 'or else', He is a loving and merciful God who knows how and why we can stray and desire holiness at the same time. Christ explains what the Ten Commandments mean by demonstrating the Father's love that underlies them.

Christ personifies the Ten Commandments, and calls us to do the same by living in the spirit of the Gospel. As we continue to press on through Lent, let us use this remaining time to assess our progress, tweak, adjust and intensify our lives of Faith, Hope, and Charity by following not just the Commandments, but the way in which Christ personified them.

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18 (26B)

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you."

When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. Lenten Regulations

Fast & Abstinence Rules: ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY are days of FAST and ABSTINENCE which means no meat and only one FULL meal—no eating between meals. Liquids are allowed. This pertains to those from age 18 to 59.

All Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat) for ages 14 onward. There is no obligation to fast the other days of Lent, but voluntary acts of penance and self-denial are recommended. Remember, the 40 days of Lent for fasting and giving up do not include Sundays which are days of rest, leisure, and joy in the Lord. The Christian faithful are to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety and charity. The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be seriously affected. People in doubt about fast or abstinence should consult their pastor.

Easter Duty Obligation: Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season (Ash Wednesday—Pentecost). Catholics are also bound to confess serious sin at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter season and more frequent confession is recommended.
